This August, if you haven't already done so, register to be an organ donor and discuss your donation decision with your family. Each and every person in Australia has a chance to make a real difference in the life of someone who is waiting for an organ or tissue transplant.

In 2017, 1,402 Australians received a lifesaving transplant through the generosity of 510 deceased organ donors and their families who agreed to a donation at the time of their loved one's death. One organ and tissue donor can save and transform the lives of ten or more people.

If you want your family to honour your decision, then they need to know. You also need to know your family's donation decisions so you can fulfil their wishes.

Registering to be a donor directly influences consent rates, with 90 per cent of families agreeing to donation proceeding when their loved one is registered. This drops to 40 per cent when the family is unaware of their loved one's donation decision. Knowing what their loved one wanted brings comfort to families at a very difficult time.

ORGAN DONATION MYTHS

Organ donation is against my religion.

Most religions support organ and tissue donation as an act of compassion and generosity. Religious leaders from the Islamic, Hindu, Catholic, Jewish Buddhist and Greek Orthodox faiths have all acknowledged their support for donation. If you are not sure whether your religion



is supportive, speak to your religious adviser. You can also visit www.donatelife.gov.au to find information on organ and tissue donation for people of a diverse range of faith, cultural and language backgrounds.

I'm too old, too young or not healthy enough to donate.

Almost anyone can donate their organs and tissue. While your age and medical history will be considered, you shouldn't assume you are too old, too young or not healthy enough. There's every chance that some of your organs and tissues will be suitable for donation. Only some medical conditions may prevent you from being a donor, such as transmissible diseases like HIV.

My family won't be able to view my body.

Yes, they will. The removal of organs and tissue is no different from any other surgical operation, and is performed by highly skilled health professionals. The donor's body is always treated with dignity and respect. The donation of organs and tissue does not alter the physical appearance of the body, and your family will be able to view your body and have an open casket if they wish.

I've already registered. I don't need to tell my family.

You do need to discuss your decision with your family and friends, even if you have registered on the Australian Organ Donor Register.

Donation won't proceed without your family's consent. Families are less likely to give consent for donation if they do not know the donation decision of the deceased. That's why every family is encouraged to discuss and know each other's decision.

If you are willing to one day save lives as an organ and tissue donor, please register your donation decision online today at <https://register.donatelife.gov.au/>

It only takes a minute or two, all you need is your Medicare Card number.

If you previously recorded a donation decision on your state driver's licence, you still need to join the Australian Organ Donor Register.

**Dingley Village
Historical Society**

- Settled 1855 -

WHERE DO YOU LIVE? Thomas Attenborough and his sister Mary arrived in the Port Phillip colony in July 1853 and within three years they had purchased 170 acres of bushland from Patrick Riley for 280 pounds.

They then built a home, erected fences, grew vegetables and stocked the property with cattle and sheep. Thomas and Mary named their house "Dingley Grange" after Dingley Hall, which exists in Dingley in his native Northamptonshire, England. The surrounding area then became known as Dingley

In 1989 a local committee was formed to "let's put the Village back into Dingley", with a major project being the gaining of official approval to change the name Dingley to Dingley Village. The secretary of the Place Names Committee asked for evidence of community

support for such a change. The "let's put the Village back into Dingley", committee proceeded to gather evidence to support its proposal and 482 individuals signed the petition for the change of name.

On August 26, 1991, the Victorian Governments Place-names Committee confirmed by notice in the Government Gazette that the new name for Dingley was to be Dingley Village. A weekend of celebrations was held to mark the success of "Goodbye Dingley, Hello Dingley Village".

The name "Dingley Village" is now firmly entrenched in the community with most people giving it little thought.

The authorities at local and state government level know that you live in Dingley Village-----do you??

THE DUGUID PLUMBING & TILING DYNASTY

Having been raised in the Village, two young tradies are now establishing their own businesses.

The Duguid cousins, Greg (GJD Plumbing) and Cameron (Pro Notch Tiling P/L), have spent the vast majority of their lives in and around the Dingley Village area. Although running separate businesses, they often work together on joint projects such as bathroom renovations and are well qualified to service the community's needs in their respective trades.

Cameron attended Kingswood Primary and then Cheltenham Secondary College, where in 2009 he completed his VCE year, which included gaining a Certificate II in Hospitality Operations. He had thoughts at that stage to become a chef.

That thought soon changed when several of his friends started trade apprenticeships and together they had dreams of a renovation business but what skills would Cameron bring to the group of friends? Somehow, floor and wall tiling entered his head so he undertook a pre-apprenticeship course at Holmes-glen TAFE to see if he was suited to it. Turns out he was, so much so that he was awarded Best Pre-Apprentice for tiling by the Master Builders Association! an apprenticeship in June 2011, learning on the job around the south-eastern suburbs. Although the apprenticeship course is usually for four years, his competency was acknowledged after two years and in November 2013, he started out on his own as a qualified tiler. He has formed strong associations



with several builders and local tile retail stores and mainly from word of mouth recommendations is establishing a successful business.

During his teenage years and then while an apprentice he worked on a casual basis at the now Dingley Village Woolworths and also delivered the Dossier as a schoolboy, but passed that on to his father Tom who still carries out that role.

Cameron is currently living in a Dingley residence that he and his mates are renovating when time permits.

Greg attended Dingley Primary School and then Parkdale Secondary College. At the end of Year 10, he left school to follow in his father's footsteps to become a plumber.

Greg did his apprenticeship with his father Colin, a Dingley Village resident for thirty-two years, and then continued in his employ for a further twelve years, working together on large architectural projects as well as general household plumbing.

Following his father's retirement two years ago, Greg took over and became his own boss, concentrating on local general

plumbing and bathroom renovations. He is married with two young sons.

Greg and Cameron are available to discuss your tradie queries, whether it be a small repair job or a large renovation that they can project manage in conjunction with other local, qualified tradesmen.

Save Kingswood Central Park from Destruction

Save Kingswood Group Inc August 2018 URGENT UPDATE

Say No Rezoning, Say No Subdivision, Say No Over-development.

By now you may know that State Planning Minister Wynne has authorised public exhibition of the rezoning plans for Kingswood Golf Course from the 19th July for a period of 6 weeks.

Kingston Council tell us that the zoning “Amendment, planning permit and supporting information for the proposal and details on how to lodge a submission will be available on the Department's website, our website, Cheltenham office, and Dingley Library during this time. A mail out to Dingley residents and landowners notifying them of the combined Amendment and Permit will also occur along with other media communication.” We understand however that the plans are substantially unchanged from previous displays.

***“We’re Not Going To Sit In Silence !
We’re Not Gonna Live With Fear !”***

You must have heard of all the downgrades Dingley Village will have to endure if this horrendous plan is approved. We want the land to remain open space for public recreational use, not bulldozed and built out wall to wall with three storey flats on lots a third the size of current Dingley Village lots.

Despite overwhelming rejection of the developer's plan by Dingley Village residents, your Council officers have been working with the developers to find a way to satisfy statutory requirements and therefore gain the Minister's approval to trash Dingley Village by this massive over-development.

"Local community groups play an important role in strengthening the Kingston community and helping the disadvantaged," Cr Staikos said. "Kingston Council, through the Kingston Charitable Fund, is pleased and proud to support them to continue their good work."

The 2018 Kingston Charitable Fund grant recipients are:

Abbeyfield Society Dingley Village Inc. - \$1,499 to purchase a steam cleaner for Abbeyfield House Dingley Village. The appliance will be used by staff for carpets, upholstery and general cleaning. Melbourne Anglican Benevolent Society Inc. - \$5,000 to support the cost of food distributed to guests of Pantry 5000 and the provision of Christmas hampers to families in need..

Make A Difference Dingley Village Inc.

- \$7,000 to assist clients with the cost of utility bills according to the urgency of the situation.

Springvale Benevolent Society Inc. -

\$2,000 to offer hampers and vouchers to disadvantaged residents during the Christmas period.

Bonbeach Life Saving Club Inc. - \$5,227

to purchase four new rescue boards for the Bonbeach Life Saving Club.

Lighthouse Foundation - \$2,500 to

maintain and grow the Bonbeach House Community Committee through recruitment, education and training.

Bayside Community Information And Support Service Inc. - \$2,000 to produce

and maintain 'Homeless packs' specifically for supporting this people identifying as homeless or at risk of homelessness.

St Kilda Mums - \$3,600 to support disadvantaged

families in the City of Kingston with the purchase of prams, cot packages and car restraints.

Mums Supporting Families In Need Inc. - \$3,600 to contribute towards ware-

house rental where donated items are received, sorted, cleaned, fixed, packed and despatched to families in need.

The Kingston Charitable Fund raises money from local business and philan-

thropic communities in the municipality, which is then invested and the annual income earned is distributed back to the community in the form of grants. It is a charitable fund account of the Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation, which has been inspiring philanthropy since 1923.

NEW PUBLIC TOILET FACILITIES OPENED

New public toilet facilities have opened in Dingley Village and Clayton to serve the community when they are out and about.

Mayor Steve Staikos said new toilets have been completed at Dingley Reserve and Bald Hill Park in Clayton.

"Public toilet facilities provide a vital community service and allow people of all ages – particularly the elderly, parents with young children and people with medical conditions – to get out and about with access to modern conveniences," Cr Staikos said.

"Kingston Council invests \$450,000 annually on upgrading/replacing public toilet facilities in addition to the significant costs on cleaning and regular maintenance."

Council has set out a 10-year action plan to ensure public toilets across Kingston are strategically located, provided free-of-charge and improved or replaced where necessary.

The new strategy was adopted in 2016 following extensive consultation with community groups and a public survey with over 400 responses.

It identified priority public toilets for major works over the next 10 years.

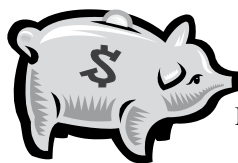

SUPER IN YOUR 60S. IT'S STILL NOT TOO LATE!

For most Australians, their 60s is the decade that marks retirement. For some this means a graceful slide into a fulfilling life of leisure, enjoying the fruits of a lifetime of hard work. However, for many it means a substantial drop in income and living standards. So how can you make the most of the last few years of work before taking that big step into retirement?

Are we there yet?

Allowing for future age pension entitlement the Association of Superannuation Funds of Australia (ASFA) calculates that a couple will need savings of \$640,000 at retirement to maintain a 'comfortable lifestyle'. (ASFA equates 'comfortable' to an annual income of \$60,264.)

How are we tracking as a nation?

In 2015-2016, 50% of men aged 60-64 had super balances of less than \$110,000. For women the figure was a more alarming \$36,000 – not even enough to provide a single person with a 'modest' lifestyle. (ASFA estimates that to upgrade from a 'pension only' to a 'modest' lifestyle would require a retirement nest egg of \$70,000.)

Last minute lift

If your super is looking a little on the thin side there are a few ways to give it a boost before retirement.

- Make the most of your concessional contributions cap. Ask your employer if you can increase your employer contributions under a 'salary sacrifice' arrangement. Alternatively, you can claim a tax deduction for personal contributions you make. Total concessional contributions must not exceed \$25,000 per year, although from July 2018 you may be able to carry forward any unused portion of this cap for up to five years.
- Investigate the benefits of a 'transition to retirement' (TTR) income stream. This can be combined with a re-contribution strategy that, depending on your marginal tax rate, can give your retirement savings a significant boost.
- Review your investment strategy. A common view is that as we near retirement our investments should be shifted to the conservative end of the risk and return spectrum. However, in an age of low returns and longer life expectancies, some growth assets may be required to provide the returns that will be necessary to support a long and comfortable retirement.
- Make non-concessional contributions. If you have substantial funds outside of super, it may be worthwhile transferring them into the concessionally taxed super environment. You can contribute up to \$100,000 per year, or \$300,000

within a three-year period. A work test applies if you are over 65.

- The 60s is often a time for home downsizing. This can free up some cash to help with retirement. The 'downsizer contribution' allows a couple to jointly contribute up to \$600,000 to superannuation without it counting towards their non-concessional contributions caps.

Bye-bye tax, hello aged pension?

One reward, just for turning 60, is that any withdrawals from your super account will be tax-free. This applies to both lump sum withdrawals and income stream payments. Depending on the preservation status of your funds, you may need to meet a condition of release to access your superannuation.

Based on your date of birth, somewhere between age 65 and 67 you will reach age pension age. The age pension is subject to both an assets test and an income test and some advanced planning can boost your eligibility for the pension. For example, the family home is exempt from the assets test. Releasing cash by downsizing may reduce your eligibility for the age pension.

Get it right

This important decade is when you will make the key decisions that will determine your quality of life in retirement. Those decisions are both numerous and complex. EYES RIGHT

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF BEHAVIOURAL OPTOMETRY AND JAY GOING ON AN ADVENTURE

A few weeks ago I went to the international conference of behavioural optometry in Sydney. I had the opportunity to meet some amazing behavioural optometrists from around the world. There were speakers who enlightened us on how anxiety and stress can affect the visual process, the power of vision therapy for rehabilitation of patients with brain injuries, different philosophies of prescribing optical lenses and more on the emerging myope and myopia control.

Perhaps the most interesting and informative talks were given by Patti Andrich who is an occupational therapist trained vision therapist in the United States. She talked about primitive reflexes and how the integration of these reflexes is essential to establish connections between vision and other senses. Primitive reflexes are seen in all new-borns and eventually become integrated throughout the infant's development. Some reflexes that might be familiar include the grasp

reflex where the baby's fingers grasps the objects when touched or the rooting reflex when the baby's mouth opens when touched which is important for feeding.

In some children certain reflexes can be retained even when starting school which can hinder their ability to learn and coordinate their body. The primitive reflexes can be retained for a number of reasons including trauma at birth, falls, head injury, skipping or delays in crawling and chronic ear infections. An appropriate vision therapist can check for retained primitive reflexes and re-visit the developmental milestones that might have been missed.

Vision therapy can be used to make connections between vision and other senses such as auditory, tactile, and vestibular systems to integrate the retained reflexes with the central nervous system. The conference was a great insight into how behavioural optometry is growing around the world.

I am also saddened to say this will be my last article for the Dingley Dossier. My husband and I have decided to take a year off to travel the world. I will be finishing up at the Dingley Eye Centre at the end of July to commence our travels in August.

It has been a pleasure seeing you all and I will sincerely miss the patients and team at Dingley Eye Centre. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time working amongst such incredible people.

EXERCISE IS MEDICINE

The term, "exercise is medicine" is often used to help manage people with hip and knee osteoarthritis but how true is this phrase?

A recent article in the Journal of Orthopaedic and Sport Physiotherapy highlighted that there is high quality research that exercise can help reduce pain and improve joint movement. INTERVENTION ORDERS

Intervention Orders are court orders that place legal restrictions on one person against another person/s. It may prohibit an individual from being within a certain distance from another person. It may also place restrictions on a particular person communicating with another and so on.

The Magistrates Court can make intervention orders to protect people who have experienced violent, threatening or abusive behaviour.

What are they

There are two types of intervention orders:

- (i) A family violence intervention order helps to protect you from a family member who is violent to you. These types of orders can be sought under the Family Violence Protection Act 2008 where there is a family relationship or a person is or has been involved in a relationship.
- (ii) A personal safety intervention order helps to protect you from someone, other than a family member, who makes you feel unsafe. These types of orders can be under the Personal Safety Intervention Orders Act 2010 where there is no family relationship or the parties are neighbours or friends.

In some instances application for an Intervention Order is made or sought by the Police. In other circumstances a

person will be required to make their own application. This will involve making an application to the Magistrates Court

Interim orders

A magistrate can make an interim order if they believe a person is not safe and needs protecting immediately. It usually lasts until a magistrate decides whether to make a final order.

An interim order can be made without the respondent being at court or knowing about the order. It has the same effect as a final intervention order.

Final orders

A magistrate can make a final order after they have heard the evidence at a contested hearing. The magistrate must be satisfied that the respondent has committed family violence or threats and is likely to do so again. A magistrate can also make a final order if both sides agree (consent) to the order being made, the respondent has not opposed the order, by for example, they did not turn up to the hearing.

If an Interim Order has been taken out against you, you will be served a copy of the order. This means the Police will contact you in relation to the Interim Order and the Police will provide you with a copy of the Interim Order.

Legal assistance

Intervention orders are not simple and can have far reaching consequences particularly where children are named on an

order. Therefore, if you are considering making an application for an Intervention Order, are subject to one, or are considering defending one, it is important that you seek legal advice even if only as a one off.

It is also important that you understand the potential consequences of any breach of any Intervention Order including an interim one as a breach may have criminal consequences - meaning you might be arrested and charged by Police.

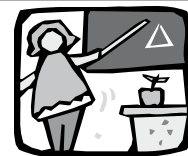

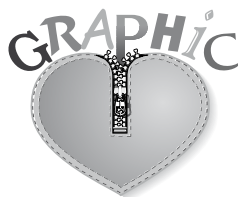
