- Work or lack of work can make us feel frazzled or inadequate
- Falling short of our goals can make us feel hopeless
- Death of loved ones can sap us of energy and hope
- Relationships breaking up can make us confused, sad or angry

# We all need conversations.

And that's why we all need to ask people around us "are you ok?"

By giving someone the opportunity and the time to share what they're feeling, we're giving that person something truly invaluable.

We're giving that person a sense of connection and a sense of belonging.

Got a niggling feeling that someone you know or care about it isn't behaving as they normally would? Perhaps they seem out of sorts? More agitated or withdrawn? Or they're just not themselves. Trust that gut instinct and act on it.

# COUNCIL AWARDS \$1.46 MILLION IN GRANTS TO KINGSTON COMMUNITY GROUPS

Kingston's community groups will share in \$1.46 million to continue their good work thanks to the City of Kingston's annual community grants.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said the grants will assist many not-for-profit groups and help them deliver a wide range services, programs and special events to the community.

"There are so many fantastic community groups doing great work across Kingston, Council is proud to be able to support their efforts," Cr Oxley said.

The 2019–20 Community Grants funding includes:

- \$1.13 million for three-year Partnership Grants to key organisations that provide important social and welfare services to Kingston residents, including community centres, neighbourhood houses and organisations which run community events
- \$305,916 in Annual Grants of up to \$10,000 for not-for-profit community groups for once-off activities which help develop a healthy, active and socially connected community, and
- \$26,715 in Arts Grants.

This is in addition to \$116,258 to be allocated throughout the year in Irregular Grants, Individual Development Grants, Schools Development Grants, and Culturally Diverse Meals Grants.

The 2019–20 Community Grants Program attracted a total of 220 grant applications, which includes 75 Partnership and 145 Annual Grants applications. Successful grants included:

- \$539,533 to support local neighbourhood houses and community centres
- \$72,172 to support the Chelsea and Moorabbin SES units
- \$47,756 to support local multicultural and seniors' groups
- \$367,749 in funding for a range of community welfare organisation programs, including \$34,218 towards Mentone Community Assistance and Information Bureau \$38,495 towards Peninsula Community Legal Centre and \$14,279 towards Pantry 5000;
- \$3090 each to the Dingley Village Historical Society, Mordialloc Historical Society and Chelsea Historical Society.

# NORTH WARD COUNCIL MEETING - A RESOUNDING NO TO 3-STOREY HOUSING

Over 200 attended the Council's North Ward meeting on August 6 2019, held to seeking community feedback on the recently released Housing Strategy and Neighbourhood Character Study.

At the meeting a clear and loud message was given to our Councillors - WE DON'T WANT

# 3-STOREY HOUSING IN DINGLEY VILLAGE.

The Study has been developed over the past 2 years and sets out the types of development preferred in different parts of Kingston to manage housing growth over the next 20 years, designating where areas of minimal, incremental and substantial change may be appropriate. DVCA supports Council's overall concept of undertaking of the Housing Strategy and Neighbourhood Character Study.

However DVCA DOES NOT SUP-PORT THE DRAFT STUDY released by Council, which would allow medium density 3-storey housing to be built all along Centre Dandenong Rd, on the Kingswood Golf Course Driving Range and around Dingley Village shopping centre, including the streets adjacent to Corrigan Oval.

DVCA is strongly of the view that Dingley Village is unique due to its size, location, and current neighbourhood character. There is no 3-storey housing in Dingley Village and we believe there is no need or justification to alter our zoning to higher than 2-storey housing development. Especially as huge development elsewhere in Kingston will cater for the proposed population growth. Dingley Village does not have the infrastructure, roads, parking, and the schools are already stretched to the limit.

# TO THE END OF LANDFILL & ON THE PATH TO THE CHAIN OF PARKS

Over the last few months, Council's longterm plan to see the end of landfill in Kingston has moved a few steps closer, with closures at the Victory Road green waste transfer station in Clayton and the Enviromix green waste facility in Dingley Village.

Since all new landfills were banned with the special planning protection (the Green Wedge A Zone C143 Amendment) introduced in 2015 and existing landfills closing since then, the Chain of Parks concept continues to gradually start taking shape.

Proposed first in the 1970s, the Chain of Parks will be a series of linked parks





in the Green Wedge. The parks, primarily closed and remediated landfills are to be linked by a 10 kilometre dedicated pedestrian and cycle trail running along current and future proposed parks in the Green Wedge from Karkarook Park to Braeside Park.



# WHAT IS YOUR AGED CARE **FUNDING STRATEGY?**

We're an ageing population; the media keeps reminding us, as does the government, but are we prepared for what this means? As a society? As individuals? One thing's for sure – it's something we cannot ignore.

According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, in 2018 over 3.9 million Australians were aged 65 and over.

Consider for a moment: this figure shows those people contemplating aged care for elderly family members are fast approaching the age when they'll need it themselves.

# Sobering thought.

What this means is that as aged care becomes increasingly important, the need for aged care facilities is growing proportionately. As demand out-grows supply, costs associated with residential care can only go one way.

# Fees are regulated

There are strict regulations governing aged care fees and charges. Aimed at consumer protection, a degree of flexibility within the guidelines enables aged care facilities to adapt the fee structures to meet their own financial pressures.

So as we age, and as we begin to consider the future care of not only ourselves but our older loved ones, what can we expect to pay?

# To help you estimate the costs

The government provides an online Residential Care Fee Estimator to help you estimate aged care costs here http://

www.myagedcare.gov.au/estimate-fees-
for-aged-care-services. As for the type
of fees, depending on the facility, one
or more of the following may apply (see
table below)

Type of fee	Included
Daily basic	Living costs such as meals, power, laundry.
Means-tested	An additional contribution towards cost of care determined by Department of Human Services (DHS) and based on your means-tested income and assets.
Accommodation	The government may cover part or all of this as determined by DHS income and assets means-test.
Extras/additional options	Applies where higher accommodation standards or additional services are required. Variable depending on the home and available facilities.

### Watch out for "extras"

Although the government capped annual and lifetime means-tested fees, additional charges to cover extras like hairdressing, internet access, excursions, etc, can apply. It's important to check with the facility first to find out how these extra services are offered and their associated costs. They can sometimes be disproportionate to the services supplied and add up to a substantial amount. Aged care providers must give itemised accounts to the resident breaking down each of these services and the associated charge. Legislation also states that these fees cannot be charged more than one month in advance.

This is where your financial adviser can help. Indicative of our times, strategies for wealth creation with extended pension horizons are increasingly relevant. They help to support appropriate income levels so you are less likely to need a lump sum withdrawal from your investment portfolio.

# 7 STEPS TO FINALISING A DIVORCE

When parties separate, one party will often want a "divorce" if they have been legally married. A divorce is separate from a property settlement or children's custody settlement. A divorce is a legal dissolution of the marriage to allow the parties formally separate such that they may remarry etc.

### 1. Getting started

It does not matter where the marriage occurred, under the Family Law Act you may apply for a "no fault divorce" on the grounds that the marriage has broken down irretrievably and the court will not consider why the marriage ended. At least one party must be born in Australia or is an Australian citizen or has lived in Australia for the last twelve months.

The parties can apply for a divorce provided they have been separated for more than one year. If they have remained living under one roof after separation, they will need to provide proof that they have lived separately during that period. This can done by an Affidavit stating the parties have lived separately by sleeping separately, keeping finances separate undertaking their own household chores, and as

perceived by others e.g. family, friends and the public.

Where there are children of the marriage under 18 years then parties must satisfy the Court that appropriate arrangements have been made for the welfare, care, and development of the children

If the marriage is less than two years duration then the parties must attend upon family counselling to obtain a certificate confirming that the parties attempting counselling or that one party did not attend. This certificate must be attached to the application for divorce. If the parties do not attend counselling, then they need to file an affidavit explaining why.

### 2. Completing the Application

If both parties agree to a divorce, you may apply for a Joint Application with both parties required to sign the application. If the other party does not agree to divorce you may still apply by filing a Sole Application.

Once the application is complete it must be signed in the presence of a lawyer, justice of the Peace or any other authorised person.

## 3. Filing the Application

After you have filled out and sworn or affirmed the Application for Divorce form, you may post, hand deliver or submit the Application and any other relevant documents. A certified copy photocopy of your marriage certificate must also be included.

In the event the parties have been married for less than two years, a counselling certificate will need to be filed with the Application. If the marriage was overseas, then the marriage certificate will need to be translated into English.

### 4. Serving the Application

After filing the Application you will receive a file number from the Court and a time and date for the hearing. In a joint application the Court will hold onto the original copy and provide the other party with a sealed copy, there is no requirement to serve this application on the other party.

In a sole application, you will receive both sealed copies and you will need to serve one of them on the other party at least 28 days before the hearing if the other party lives in Australia, or 42 days if the live overseas. This can be done by post or by hand through a third party.

# 5. Response to the Application

The other party may file a response to the Application after they have been served. The responding party can use the response to disagree with the information presented in the Application or oppose the Divorce.

The two main reasons a party may validly oppose a divorce is if they have not been separated for 12 months or the court does not have jurisdiction to grant a divorce.

### 6. Court Hearing

If you have filed for a sole application and there are children under the age of 18 you will be required to attend a court hearing. The Judge will ensure proper living arrangements have been made for the children as well as resolve any pending issues.

If there are no children under the 18 years or the application in joint, then the matter can be dealt with by the Courts without the need to attend Court.

### 7. The divorce becomes final

A divorce order, once granted by the

court, does not becomes final until one month and one day after its grant. Therefore, you should not finalise any future plans dependant on the divorce (e.g. to remarry) until the divorce has become final.

The Family Law Courts simplify the process as much as possible giving you a chance to do it on your own with guided steps, but if you are more comfortable with a lawyer assisting you, we can ensure everything is done correctly and smoothly as well as help you with property settlements and custody arrangements.

# IT'LL BE RIGHT...

As a reformed Bogan from Ballarat, I find myself uttering the phrase "It'll be right..." on a daily basis when it comes to anything I'm unsure about. Australians are known worldwide for our laid back attitude, but a recent YouGov survey in June 2019 found that it is precisely this type of attitude that could be harming our vision!

According to the survey's results, 91% of Australian adults have experienced a certain problem with their eyes, ranging from reduced/deteriorating vision to inflamed or sore eyes and conjunctivitis. ing. Comparing the early images of our Park with today is a revelation. Empty paddocks have become open woodlands. Wetlands edged with sedges and rushes have developed into a water bird mecca. What a great debt we owe to the earliest members and Park Rangers who showed just how to transform a sewerage farm into an indigenous landscape.

It fills me with hope to think that in just 30 years such a transformation can occur. Now at the present, and into the future, the challenge is to protect this treasure. It is a big task, especially with the prospect of the construction of the Mordialloc Freeway at the bottom of the Park. The mitigation measures proposed are not going to be sufficient to protect the Park. Swales along the Freeway will have to be large, and cleaned out every 5-10 years to cope with the runoff from petrol, tyres and litter onto the road. The noise and lights, regardless of 2-3 metre walls and road surface changes, will affect the endangered Australian Bittern's booming mating call. We, the public, will lose the benefit of a quiet, healthy, green oasis. The Freeway will remove some large trees. This is a big concern. Such trees are like human's high-rise buildings providing homes for possums, bats, birds, reptiles and insects. It is to be hoped that these creatures will be removed to an appropriate habitat, and the trees' trunks re-used within the Park.

The Friends have raised this concern with Major Road Projects Victoria and I hope that the Friends' recommendation, along with those of Parks Victoria, are followed. Braeside Park is our largest open space, which is going to be even more valuable with Melbourne's everincreasing population. The Friends of

Braeside Park are determined to work with anyone to preserve this space, and welcome any members of the Public interested in maintaining the Park.

# COUNTRY WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION DINGLEY VILLAGE



This recipe was passed on to the CWA Dingley Village members and we would like to share it with the Dossier readers

It's called "Custard Apple tea cake " Oven 160 degrees, 23 cm spring form tin, lined with baking paper.

150g butter softened, 3/4 cup castor sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 2 eggs at room temperature, 2 & 1/2 cups self raising flour sifted, 1 & 1/2 cups of milk. 400g tin of Pie Apple, 300 ml double thick custard (or you can make your own) plus 1/3 cup desiccated coconut.

Cream butter and sugar until pale and creamy, add eggs one at a time beating well after each addition Fold in flour and milk alternately until just combined. Spread half the batter into prepared tin. Arrange 1/2 the apple on top. Dollop 1/2 the custard over the apple. Sprinkle with coconut. Gently spoon the remainder of the batter over the top with the remaining apple and custard. Swirl apple and custard with a skewer. Sprinkle with a little more coconut.

Bake for 1 hour 30 minutes or until cooked. Cool completely in the pan

Sprinkle with icing sugar before serving. THEN ENJOY.





# CORNISH COLLEGE

Cornish Collage celebrated the opening of the Senior Studies Centre, for our Years 11 and 12 students,



by the Hon James Merlino MP, Deputy Premier and Minister for Education Friday 26 July at 10.00am. The Minister was assisted by Mr Tim Richardson MLA, State Member for Mordialloc and Parliamentary Secretary for Schools. Rev Dr Robert Johnson, Chair of the College Board dedicated the building and spoke of the vision shown by Principal Vicki Steer in bringing the project to life. In honour of her significant legacy the landscaped area at the front of the Centre will be known as 'The Vicki Steer Green'. Thank you to the Victorian Government, the Cornish College Community and Parents' Association for creating a powerful learning environment that will make a difference to all our students for future years. As Vicki said so well, 'Today was a real Cornish team effort'.

This new centre will give senior students at Cornish College dedicated spaces to learn in the crucial VCE years.

The design of the building, which incorporates flexible learning spaces, as well as shared informal areas overlooking the stunning natural environment of Cornish, was driven by three key imperatives.

## Learning environment

To create a learning environment for Years 11 and 12 students, where powerful learning, suited to the demands for global competencies, can take place.

# **Connection with the outdoors**

We recognise the importance of maintaining a visual and physical connection with our beautiful grounds and external environment, as a key design element for student wellbeing.

# Sustainability embedded in the design and construction

Sustainability initiatives include orientation of the building to the north; roof design that includes three pop-up roof lights with vertical glazing that bring natural daylight deep into the internal learning spaces; interlinked motorised windows with roof mounted ventilators to provide fresh air during warm days; double-glazed windows; LED lighting; hot water heated by an energy efficient heat-pump.

The building construction also incorporates passive sustainability features including thermal mass in the concrete slab; glue laminated timber structure; acoustic ceiling system of sustainably harvested shredded timber and wool; high volume spaces for thermal comfort and high oxygen capacity; extensive shaded glazing; an airlock at the main entry; low/no volatile organic compound materials.


