THE HIDDEN CRISIS OF COVID-19

While the global COVID-19 crisis is unprecedented, it's left many victims of domestic and family abuse inside their homes with their abuser – all day, every day. As people isolate to prevent the spread of the virus it makes it even harder to get help.

Google searches for domestic violence have grown by 75 per cent since the outbreak of the virus, while women's services in NSW have seen a 40 per cent increase in the number of domestic violence cases since the lockdown began.

"Domestic and family violence was already at crisis levels in the community before this pandemic hit," says Renata Field, spokesperson for DVNSW (Do-

mestic Violence NSW). "As a result of the COVID-19 crisis, the stresses for every family are increased when we are living on top of each other 24/7. In addition, people are experiencing financial pressure, which makes matters worse in abusive relationships."

There are ways to seek help discreetly, safe steps Family Violence Response Centre offer confidential 24/7 online support and can provide advice about safety planning and emergency accommodation to keep victims safe from family violence.

COMMUNITY SURVEY HELPS GUIDE COVID-19 ROAD TO RECOVERY

Kingston Council has launched a survey to check-in with our community during COVID-19 and on the road to recovery.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said the new community survey will help Kingston Council better support the Kingston community during the COVID-19 crisis.

"By taking part, you can provide up-to-date information on the impacts of COVID-19, help Council understand how our community is responding, and identify any gaps in local services," Cr Oxley said.

"The results will help both Council and community services provide targeted support and respond to community needs through these challenging times to ensure we are caring for our community."

How can you help? Simply sign up to take part in a short ongoing survey: weekly for the first 2 months and then a monthly check-in. The survey will take about five minutes to complete and includes a range of topics including:

- What challenges are you facing from social isolation?
- Do you have any concerns around catching the virus?
- How you are getting information on COVID-19?
- What is providing relief/support for you during this time?

DOG-LITTER BAGS TO BE ROLLED OUT IN KINGSTON AFTER SUCCESSFUL TRIAL

Free dog-litter bags will soon be available at select dog off-leash parks and reserves across Kingston following a successful 6-month trial of dog-litter dispensers.

Kingston Mayor Georgina Oxley said as a dog lover she really wants to see Kingston become as dog-friendly as possible.

“My dog Banjo and I love to get exercise at Kingston’s fantastic off-leash

areas but it’s important all dog owners do the right thing and pick-up after their pooches, so everyone in the community can enjoy our reserves, parks and beaches,” said Cr Oxley.

“That’s why we are making it easier for dog owners and will be providing dog-litter bag dispensers at select off-leash parks and reserves across Kingston,” he continued.

Council will also look to expand this to other larger, popular dog off-leash reserves.

Council also recently approved plans to fence two popular dog off-leash areas at Roy Dore Reserve in Carrum and Iluka Reserve in Aspendale.

“The fencing is designed to provide better separation between dogs and other park users and is something the community had been asking us for,” Cr Oxley said.

Community consultation was conducted in April and May 2019 with support for both projects especially Roy Dore.

“Along with the new fencing, Council will put in irrigation, bins, seats and a drinking fountain and additional works will be undertaken at Roy Dore to provide a shelter, path networks and garden beds,” said Cr Oxley.

CITY OF KINGSTON COUNCIL WARD CHANGES

The new Local Government Act 2020 (Vic) (the new Act) marks the first comprehensive overhaul of local government in Victoria for over 30 years. The new Act introduces wide-ranging reforms to improve democracy, accountability and service delivery across Victoria's 79 councils.

This new Act is the result of extensive consultation with councils, rate-payers, stakeholders and communities to reform how local government works in Victoria.

The new Act replaces the Local Government Act 1989 (Vic) (the old Act) and seeks to simplify outdated and somewhat convoluted local government processes. The aims of the new Act are underpinned by the ambitions of improving local government democracy, accountability and council operations, including the ability of local government to respond to emergencies like the current COVID-19 crisis.

The first phase of reforms from the new Act took effect on 6 April 2020 with several other transitional stages occurring this year and up until 1 July 2021.

Under the new Act, 10 councils will be changing their electoral structure for the 2020 local government elections and Kingston is one of them. The City of Kingston will now move to 11 Wards with a single councillor representing each Ward.

Minister for Local Government Adem Somyurek stated that "Single member Wards support accountability, equity and grassroots democracy." and "This is about giving people more confidence in local government, because strong councils build strong communities."

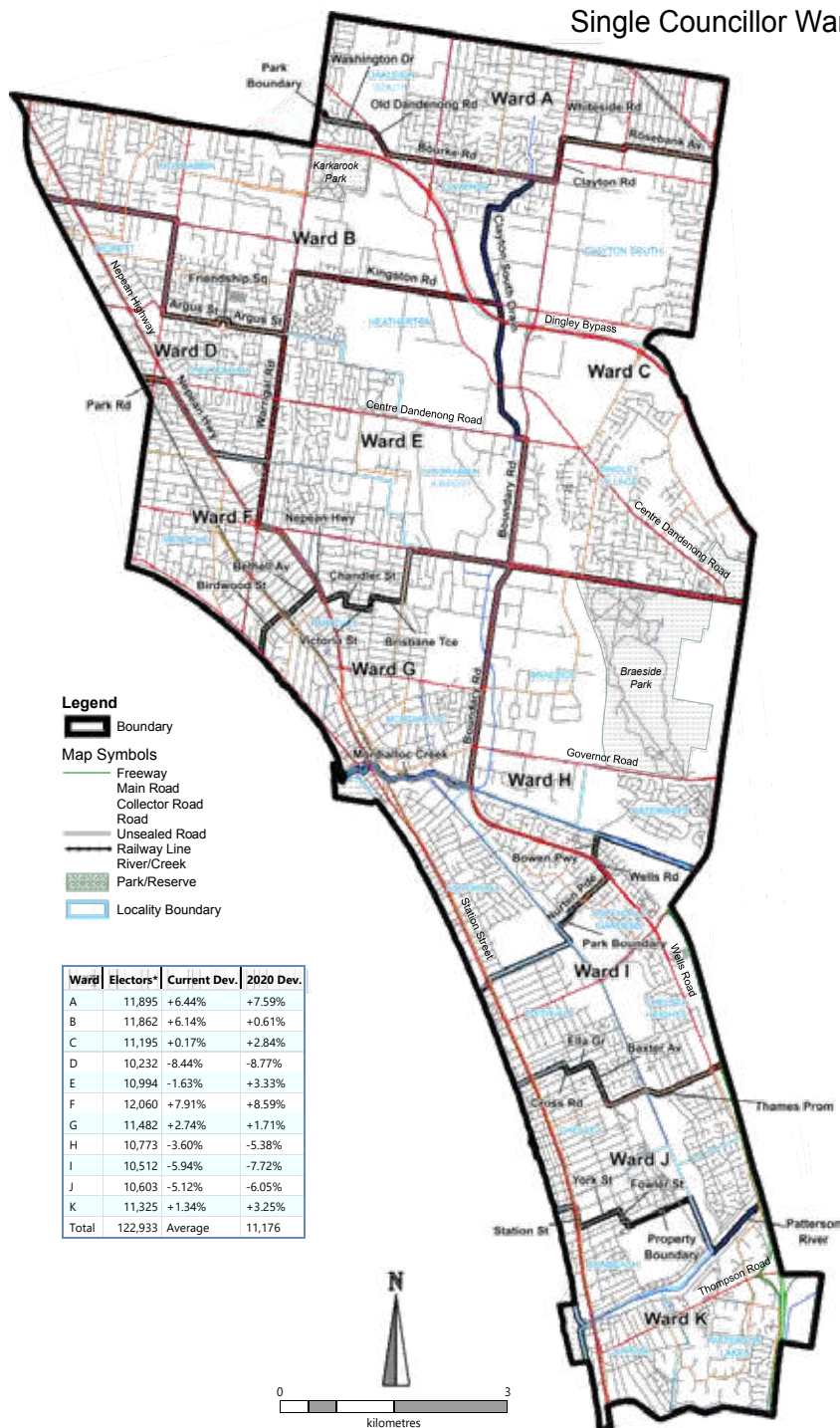
The City of Kingston will go from 3 Wards to 11 Wards and from 3 Councillors per Ward to 1 councillor per Ward.

Dingley Village currently in North Ward with three Councillor's, will be in Ward C with one Councillor at the next Council elections in October 2020.

What is the risk of getting COVID-19 infection through food?

There is no current evidence you become infected by

eating the coronavirus. It's a respiratory virus transmitted mainly via nose and eyes, not a gastrointestinal virus. The acid in our stomach is expected to inactivate the virus. You only need to wash your produce in water prior to eating you do not need to use soap or detergent.

All produce is sold direct to you by the farmer or producer, ensuring you get access to fresh produce as well as the opportunity to talk to the farmer/producer about their produce.

Despite continuing to live with the restrictions of the Corona virus lockdown, DVCA members have not stopped working on current Dingley Village issues for the improvement of our village. We hope everyone continues to be safe and healthy during this time.

CORONA VIRUS - DINGLEY VILLAGE

Whilst the lockdown has brought many challenges and difficulties to our community, the requirement to stay home is providing valuable time out for some, from our normally busy lifestyles.

Remember this is a valuable opportunity to get busy with things, such as:

- tackling craft or other hobbies,
- cleaning up the garden, to make it look it's best
- rolling up the sleeves up with some home improvements or projects
- getting active - cycling, walking or other sport when allowed

IMPORTANT CITY OF KINGSTON COUNCIL WARD CHANGES - DINGLEY VILLAGE

State Government has now legislated a new Local Government Act 2020, which includes a change to the City of Kingston Council Wards and Councillor representation.

What is changing?

- Current 3 existing Kingston Council Wards; North, Centre & South, to be replaced with 11 new Wards.
- Current number of Councillors to increase from 9 to 11, with a single Councillor to be elected in each of the 11 new Wards.
- Dingley Village to be located in Ward C and represented by a single Councillor. Dingley Village will no longer be in North Ward and represented by 3 Councillors.

When Does This Happen?

Kingston Council Ward changes will occur at our next Council elections this year are scheduled for this year in October 2020. Due to the Corona virus, these next Council elections may use postal voting to elect our Councillor in Ward C (Dingley Village).

Why Is This Occurring?

The State Government has been reviewing the Local Government Act 1989 and preparing a new Act over the past 4 years.

In this new Local Government Act changes to Council electoral structures have been made, which the State Government states are being implemented to support closer relationships between Councillors and their communities. As a consequence, Kingston Council is among 8 other Councils to have their electoral structures changed to new single Councillor Wards at the next Council elections to be held this year.

Last year, as part of the Local Government Act review, a Local Council Representation Review was carried out by the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC). The VEC review recommended an increase in the number of Councillors from 9 to 11, due to the current and projected population growth in the City of Kingston.

DVCA made a submission to this VEC review arguing for no change to the current number of Councillors and Ward structures in Kingston Council. DVCA was also against single Councillor representation for each Ward, on the basis of possible poor Ward representation from a Councillor and that the diversity of areas (beach side, green wedge, industrial, residential) would make agreement on issues more difficult with single Ward Councillors.

Challenges for Dingley Village - Ward C Voters?

Now that the new Act has been legislated, when the Council elections occur later this year, you as a voter will be responsible for selecting the best person at the next election to represent Dingley Village over the next 4 years.

It is vital that Dingley Village has the best representation on Council, to continue the work carried out for Dingley Village by our current North Ward Councillors.

Care and consideration to select the best candidate for our village will be needed. Our new Ward C Councillor will need to demonstrate their ability to have the time, ability and commitment to successfully address and support Dingley Village issues and represent all voters at Kingston Council.

What Next?

DVCA will continue to monitor and provide further update/s on the forthcoming Kingston Council elections over the next months.

CHADWICK RESERVE REDEVELOPMENT

Work continues to be carried out by Council on the Chadwick Reserve redevelopment during the corona virus lockdown, providing our community with a great new sporting facility.

These Chadwick Reserve redevelopment works, being carried out in stages include:

- a new pavilion (stage 2)
- improved playing surface on the junior AFL/cricket oval and training area (stage 1)
- lighting for the playing areas (stage 1)
- new playground and shared paths.

Over the past couple of months Council has been undertaking community consultation on the design for the new pavilion (stage 2). DVCA members have been working hard to get the best possible outcome for our community and have continued to actively discuss, review and provide feedback on the Council's Chadwick Reserve redevelopment plans during lockdown, by means of video conferencing and on-site meetings with Council.

Dingley Village Crime Report (KNS 33) **April 2020**

The last few months have been a very unusual and disconcerting time for everyone under the “Stage 3 social isolation” guidelines. We have all had to make many changes to the way we live and do business. Our thoughts are with those who have lost jobs or suffered reduced income. Police wish to thank everyone for their adaptability, resilience, patience and calmness, and especially for abiding by the social distancing guidelines to keep us all safer. Together, we are all getting through this unsettling period, and it will all be worth it in the end. Please be kind to each other and be mindful of your physical and mental health until things return to normal.

Police are pleased to report that for the month of April 2020, there were NO reported incidences of burglary, theft of motorcar, theft from motorcar or robbery in the Dingley (KNS 33) area.

There were, however, incidences of these crimes in other parts of Dingley and surrounding suburbs.

So please continue to look out for your neighbourhood, maintain your vigilance, lock up your valuables and immediately report any suspicious activity to 000.

In general terms, thefts from motorcars continue to be a problem across all areas of Kingston, Bayside and Glen Eira. It is shocking to note how many cars are left unlocked in the streets and driveways, whilst the owners are oblivious inside

their homes! Opportunistic criminals trawl the streets at night actively trying doorhandles and looking into car windows for easy valuables left on display that are worth stealing. Remember – if you feed a stray cat, it will keep returning for a feed..... criminals are the same! Please always lock your vehicle (and double-check the door handle to ensure it is).

In addition, we continue to see home break-ins (burglaries) at residences where expensive high-end luxury cars are visible outside the address. These expensive cars are very desirable to criminals, who will often break in to homes at night in order to get

the car keys and steal the car. Alarming, entry to many of these homes is through unlocked back or front doors, or by using the garage remote control found in another unlocked car outside the address.

Please store your luxury vehicles inside a locked garage at night (out of sight) and ensure ALL of your external doors and windows are locked. Do NOT leave garage remote controls or valuables on display inside any cars overnight.

DINGLEY FOOTBALL NETBALL CLUB

At the time of writing these notes {mid May}, it appears possible that abbreviated Football and Netball Seasons could eventuate; possibly the equivalent of the second half of the programmed season. Whatever happens, your club will be strongly represented by a great group of players who have continued to prepare to play whenever that is possible.

Local sports clubs face huge challenges over coming years and only those with strong supporter bases will survive and prosper.

What is known is that football at the elite AFL level will not be played in front of the usual hungry crowds.

For those starved of live football action, this represents an opportunity to get behind and support your great local club.

This therefore is an early 'call to arms', if you like, to all our loyal supporters to attend games, to show support for and fly the colours.

The DFNC Juniors face the same challenges and I offer the following tid

bits of history to highlight the importance of a strong under age section and the role it has played over the years.

As far back as 1960 there was an Under 17 team, coached by senior player Richie Mickelborough.

Those boys basically formed the 'reserves numbers' for the one senior team and some of them would play for their side in the morning and fill in spots in the seniors in the afternoon.

It was, however, more than a decade before some great stalwarts of the club, John Larter and Brian Dingle organised two junior teams, an Under 13s in 1970 and an Under 15s in 1971, to compete in the then SESFL,

The Under 15's were coached by John Holt, another great Dingley man. A picture of that team appears below.

Those early teams were the catalyst for the current situation, where the club boasts hundreds of players in all age groups in more than a dozen teams plus a huge Auskick body.

The Captains of all our six senior premiership teams through the years are products of those junior teams.

Dozens more have become senior best and fairest winners and ten ex juniors have progressed through to VFL/AFL level.

The club's strength and recent success is firmly based on an unswerving path of promoting our young talent at all times.

We hope to be able to 'get out there' again soon, and we want all Dingley footy fans along for the ride.

BEAT THE SCAMMERS AT THEIR OWN GAME

We've all seen media reports about ordinary Australians losing their entire savings after responding to a phone, email or mail offer that was impossible to resist. While some people may be naïve, scammers are also getting smarter.

Financial stings have become a serious threat to Australian consumers and businesses. According to the ACCC's Scamwatch website, there were 167,796 reports of scam in 2019, for a total loss of more than \$140 million!

All shapes and sizes

Identity theft scams involve someone stealing another person's identity and can do anything with it from cleaning out bank accounts to taking out fake mortgages. But scams can come in many guises, including, but not limited to:

- Online account and money transfer scams;
- Health and medical scams;
- Superannuation scams;
- Get-rich-quick scams;
- Lottery and competition scams.

If it sounds too good to be true...

Let's look at the most damaging of all - investment scams.

Scammers know and use all sorts of tricks to entice the vulnerable but there are steps you can take to protect yourself.

Scammers usually make contact "out of the blue" with a blanket offer and use tactics to pressure you into the deal. These "professionals" try to make their offer look as genuine as possible and most will have any or all of the following features:

- Quick, high returns and sometimes tax-free;
- No risk for the investor;
- Mention well-known companies or people (that are actually not involved);
- Discounts for "early-bird" investors or special allocations not available through anyone else.

Investment scams can appear very professional on the surface. By the time the victim realises the offer was too good to be true, the scammer has disappeared with their money.

What should you do?

If you receive a call or email always check the validity of the offer and provider, by asking:

1. What is your name and what company do you represent?
2. Does your company have an Australian Financial Services license and what is the license number?
3. What is your physical address?

If the caller can't or won't provide these details, it will be a scam. If they do answer, take down the details and check the Australian Securities and Investment Commission list on its MoneySmart website (www.moneysmart.gov.au) or the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) 'Scamwatch' site (www.scamwatch.gov.au).

Be proactive

Some scams aren't as obvious so always protect your personal information. Never give out bank details or transfer money to anyone you don't know or trust.

Always check your statements and report any suspicious transactions to your financial institutions. Make sure your computer and mobile devices are protected with strong passwords, anti-virus software and firewalls.

And beat the scammers at their own game – if you are contacted by one of these fraudsters, immediately report it to the ACCC via www.scamwatch.gov.au or phone 1300 795 995. Hopefully the scammer will end up the victim instead.

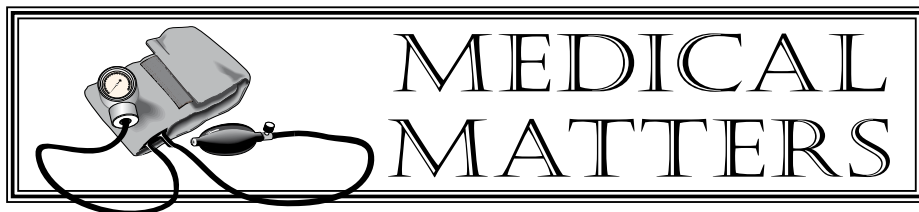

CONTINUE TO ACCESS NORMAL HEALTHCARE SERVICES

People have been urged not to avoid or cancel their regular medical appointments for non-coronavirus related health issues. Patients have been advised to call their doctors ahead but continue to seek treatment for issues such as blood pressure, heart conditions and other chronic illnesses.

"One of the things that we know from the experience of past epidemics and pandemics around the world is that often people do not continue to get the regular healthcare that they need," Professor Michael Kidd said.

"And sometimes, we see more morbidity and mortality occurring from preventable chronic conditions than actually occur from the infectious agent itself.

"And that's why it's incredibly important that everybody in Australia continues to receive the healthcare which they would normally be receiving at this time."

Your Health Care at Interhealth Medical Centre

Corona virus has changed how we do many things. It has changed the way we

shop, it has changed the way we socialize, and it has changed the way we access education. It has also changed the way we, at Interhealth Medical Clinic, provide health care. We are being told to "stay home" and we have been congratulated by our country's leaders for doing just that. Australia is proving that "flattening the curve" can be done. But what does that mean for our health care?

From the start of this crisis staff at Interhealth Medical Clinic decided that our priority would be the health and safety of our patients, our employees and our community. We are definitely still open for business-but you will notice some changes in how we provide your care. Social distancing works-so we are limiting the number of patients in the practice at any one time. When you ring for an appointment you will be asked a number of screening questions. This will help us to decide the best way to provide the care you need.

There are now 3 ways to safely consult your GP: by telephone, online video calls,

or in person. Generally, the first step will be a phone consultation, which can be booked with any of our doctors. Prescriptions can be sent to your local pharmacy, so in many circumstances the whole consultation can be conducted over the phone. However-there will be times when a face-to-face consultation is needed. Again-we are trying to do this as safely as possible-by timing visits appropriately, minimizing time spent waiting, and using protective equipment as necessary. You may be asked to wait in your car until we are ready for you. Shortly we will be introducing temperature screening for everyone as they enter the clinic.

In recent weeks we have been very focused on the risks of corona virus. Whilst this is understandable, it is important not to ignore other health issues. It remains essential to continue to treat chronic health problems-both physical and mental, as well as treat any other acute medical problems as they arise.

As GPs, we have always provided this service to the Dingley community. We are committed to continuing to provide the health care needs of our community. We remain able to provide our usual services such as vaccinations (including influenza, pneumonia and shingles), chronic disease management (including Diabetes, Heart disease, and Respiratory disease), as well as women's health checks.

We are also able to provide access to Allied Health Services such as psychology, dietician, podiatrist, physiotherapy and Diabetes Education) If you are con-

EYES RIGHT

WORKING FROM HOME WITH TOO MUCH SCREEN TIME: DIGITAL EYE STRAIN

With more and more people working from home Digital Eye Strain (DES) or Computer Vision Syndrome (CVS) is more relevant than ever. Depending on the source, an average worker spends about six to seven hours per day on the computer, either in the office or working from home.

DES/CVS describes a group of eye and vision-related problems that result from prolonged computer, tablet, e-reader and mobile phone use. The level of discomfort tends to increase with the amount of digital screen use and typically abates with rest.

Over the next three months our articles will cover what digital eye strain is, how it is caused and what can be done to treat it.

The most common symptoms associated with DES are eyestrain, headaches, blurred vision, and dry eyes in addition to neck and shoulder pain. These symptoms may be caused by poor lighting, glare from screens, improper viewing distances, poor sitting posture, uncorrected vision problems or a combination of these factors.

The extent to which individuals experience visual symptoms often depends on the level of their visual abilities and

the amount of time spent working at near distances; some people are better able to bear the load than others. Uncorrected or vision problems like long sightedness or astigmatism, inadequate eye focusing or coordination skills and age related changes of the eyes, such as presbyopia can also contribute to the development of visual symptoms.

Many of the visual symptoms experienced by users are temporary and will decline after stopping computer work or use of the digital device. However, in some cases some individuals may experience ongoing difficulties, such as blurred distance vision, even after resting. If nothing is done to address the cause of the problem, the symptoms will likely continue and possibly worsen with continued near demand.

Prevention or reduction of the vision problems associated with digital eye strain involves taking steps to control lighting and glare on the screen, establishing proper working distances and posture for screen viewing and assuring that even minor vision problems are properly corrected. Next month's edition will address the causes of digital eye strain in more detail and how it is diagnosed.

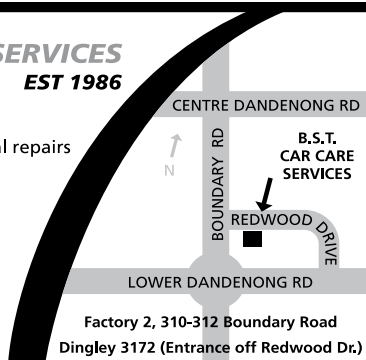
