Dingley Village resident named Kingston's 2021 Woman of the Year

Simone Hardham, a local woman who has dedicated much of her life to supporting her community, particularly in the area of mental health, has been announced as the winner of this year's Kingston Woman of the Year Award. Simone Hardham accepted her coveted award from Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos at the city's annual International Women's Day event on Friday 5 March at Kingston City Hall.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the 24 outstanding nominees for this year's award made it almost impossible for judges to select just one recipient.

"Simone has dedicated much of her life to support and serve communities through volunteering, fundraising and campaigning. She works full-time, is a mum, President of a neighbourhood centre and runs the not-for-profit organisation Mindful Makings, which delivers services that positively impact the lives of those who live with mental health concerns or are secluded from others."

In her acceptance speech Simone, acknowledged the talent, dedication and efforts of the other 23 women nominated and thanked those who had nominated them. "I'm in good company here on stage with these amazing women".

Simone thanked the City of Kingston, Councillors and Mayor, for delivering such an important initiative as Kingston Woman of the Year.

Simone went on to say

"I felt compelled to organise a community event with the aim of raising awareness of mental health challenges and suicide after tragically losing my amazing dad. I went on to raise over \$30,000 for various charities in the following years. I created non-profit organisation Mindful Makings Inc., 18 months ago and with the support of my fantastic committee, we have supported hundreds of locals by blending creative activities with mindfulness. COVID-19 hit 5 months after Mindful Makings Inc., was created and instead of suspending services that had only just started, we adapted and changed our approach to support people challenged by compromised mental health and seclusion. This is when they needed us most!"

In conclusion Simone stated "It's my hope that we talk more freely about the challenges of maintaining positive mental health, create an environment where vulnerable people feel comfortable to reach out and promote community inclusion. I am proud to be recognised for my efforts however I am most proud of the people who show strength by asking for help."

During the challenges of 2020 Simone continued her role as president of the Dingley Village Neighbourhood Centre, worked full time and continued to support families experiencing genuine despair with emergency relief.

For the past 20 years Simone has worked in mostly management roles for Commonwealth and State government departments, works full time, is mum to a wonderful 9-year-old and has an incredibly supportive husband who has encouraged and supported her community work. Simone was adamant that none of what she had achieved would be possible without the amazing people and businesses in our local community. "It's because of them that I have been able to help others."

Hawthorn Football club response to Letter to the Editor: March Dingley Dossier

I refer to a Letter to the Editor in the recent edition of the Dingley Dossier in which the writer raised Hawthorn Football Club's Kennedy Community Centre development. In response to the matters raised, the following comments are provided:

- Hawthorn Football Club has undertaken an extensive public consultation process with Dingley Village residents and the Kingston community.
- Hawthorn Football Club has sought a Planning Scheme Amendment for the Kennedy Community Centre site. Inherent within this process was another extensive consultation process to ensure Dingley Village residents and the Kingston community were aware of HFC's plans. Dingley Village community and Kingston residents have been very supportive of the project.
- The community facilities that will be developed at the Kennedy Community Centre will be extensively utilised by Dingley Village residents and the Kingston community. Hawthorn Football Club is working with the local sporting leagues to enable them to fixture games at the facilities when they are developed.

- The Incorporated Document for Hawthorn Football Club's Planning Scheme Amendment explicitly states "Gaming machines as defined in the Gambling Regulation Act 2003, are prohibited from being established on the land". HFC supports this position.
- The Planning Permit for the Kennedy Community Centre contains a number of traffic and parking conditions which have been on public display.
- Hawthorn Football Club looks forward to being part of the Dingley Village community and the development of the Kennedy Community Centre.

Planning review helps build community confidence

A proactive review into planning matters has found no evidence of improper conduct at Kingston Council.

The review was sparked by planning issues at the City of Casey, with Kingston Council keen to reassure the community that no similar issues existed in Kingston.

Lawyers Holding Redlich were engaged to conduct an extensive, independent review into any local planning matters that involved key players from IBAC's Operation Sardon investigation in Casey.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said Councillors called for the review to give the community confidence that proper planning processes were followed at Kingston. "We took a proactive approach and looked into any planning applications involving people who were part of the Casey investigation plus a number of other contentious items," Cr Staikos said.

"I'm pleased to report that the review found no evidence of improper conduct. We take these issues very seriously and wanted to ensure our community had full confidence in local planning processes."

The lawyers' review also provided 13 recommendations on how to further strengthen planning processes to provide additional protection. A report on implementing the recommendations will now be prepared including:

- Maintain a register of any Councillor meetings with lobbyists
- Develop/review political donation disclosure policy
- Randomly review planning applications for auditing purposes
- Provide ongoing ethics training for Councillors and officers
- Providing training for Councillors on the Victorian Planning system
- Define which senior officers should attend meetings with applicants
- Document all meetings with external parties and lobbyists
- Ensure adequate process to report suspected misconduct.
- Develop a framework to guide Councillor 'call ins' of planning applications

- Adopt policy on election campaign return forms.
- Consider planning panel recommendations, provide
- transparent approach if recommendation not followed
- Consider ways to enhance relationships between Councillors and officers.

Pets are for life, not just for lockdowns

Kingston Council is urging new pet owners to seek advice if they are struggling to look after their furry family member.

During the 2020 COVID-19 lockdowns, many families bought a pet to provide them with companionship and there was a surge of pet ownership across Victoria. Unfortunately, as restrictions have eased, animal shelters have been filling up with pets that are being abandoned.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said there are alternative options available to pet owners who are starting to feel the strain. "Some pet owners may have found themselves grappling with time constraints, or behavioural changes in pets, that don't have you all to themselves anymore," said Cr Staikos. "If these problems are addressed early, it is possible to achieve a good outcome for everyone involved."

RSPCA Victoria offers the following advice for pet owners to take steps to adjust to this change:

- Try to maintain a routine which includes some quality time with your pets every day
- Introduce them to alone time in a positive way, i.e. leave a treat for them when you head out
- Make departures and arrivals as uneventful as possible
- Try to give them a few minutes of exercise before you head off
- Provide them with a cosy nook they can feel safe in at home
- "If families are interested in bringing a pet into their home we're really encouraging them to consider adopting a rescue pet instead, especially with our local animal shelters filling up," Cr Staikos said.

Council would also like to remind community members who have recently adopted a cat or dog, that they must be microchipped, de-sexed and registered with Council by 10 April 2021.

"This is a state-wide legislation which Councils are required to oversee, but it has many benefits – and is the best way to ensure families are reunited with their pets if they are lost or run away," said Cr Staikos.

"The registration fee also pays for parks, pet exercise equipment, the local response to dangerous animals, school education programs and monitoring of animal welfare standards in pet shops, kennels, catteries, breeding and training businesses."

This is all featured in a Free Guide to Responsible Pet Ownership, which is available in the Autumn 2021 edition of Kingston Your City. "The Free Guide also includes details about the 2021 Pet Expo, rules about keeping cats indoors at night, a map to find Kingston's 30+ off-leash parks and reserves, and details of the city's free biodegradable dog litter bags," said Cr Staikos.

Kingston Your City has been distributed to households across Kingston and is available online. To register your pets by 10 April, or to read more, visit Council's Dog and Cat Registration page.

Chadwick Reserve - What's Currently Happening?

The redevelopment of Chadwick Reserve continues at a pace and DVCA members Shirley DeWever and Jon Garrard have been working hard to get the best possible outcomes in the community consultation process.

Redevelopment is being carried out in three stages. Stage 1 is now completed, the new oval looks great and is being well used.

Current work now being undertaken includes:

- Play space upgrade - landscaping and playground improvements, BMX track upgrade, basketball half court and new fencing and paths.

- Civil drainage works which will begin in March - temporary fencing will be used to enable these works, which will temporarily reduce access to the playing fields and dog off leash area.
- Installation of wayfinding signage

The Reserve's new pavilion, part of Stage 2, is expected to commence mid 2021, with path lighting is also scheduled to be installed following completion of the pavilion.

Community asked to help prioritise urgent action to respond to the climate emergency

Kingston Council wants to work with the community to help prioritise the urgent actions needed to respond to the climate and ecological emergency.

In January last year, Council joined other cities across Australia and around the world in declaring a Climate and Ecological Emergency, recognising that urgent action was required to reduce emissions.

Council recognises that the magnitude of change required in a short amount of time is huge. So, we've put together a draft response plan that draws on the science to tell us what action will make the biggest impact in the shortest amount of time. We now need the community to tell us what they think. Draft response plan can be downloaded from:

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the draft response plan is just the first step, Council needs the community to get involved and tell us what their priorities are for urgent, scalable and meaningful action.

"We want our community to let us know if they agree with our priorities for urgent action or have other ideas about how we can respond to this climate crisis, because it affects all of us," said Cr Staikos.

"We also want to hear how you want be involved in achieving our community emissions reduction target of Net Zero by 2030. Reaching this target requires a whole of community response so it's important we all work together."

Council has committed to three main goals and a range of targets including net zero corporate emissions by 2025 and net zero community emissions by 2030. Council will also investigate opportunities to support carbon 'sinks' that reduce emissions by absorbing carbon.

"Limiting global warming to well below 2°C is going to be incredibly tough," said Cr Staikos. "Council recognises the level of investment required to reduce emission is substantial and that strong leadership is required."

Last year Kingston signed a power purchase agreement that will see all the city's street lighting and Council's large buildings powered by green energy by 1 July 2021.

In addition, it is anticipated that all remaining Council sites will also be powered by green energy under another separate contract from July this year, ensuring that 100% of Council's electricity needs will be provided by renewables.

"Sourcing Kingston's energy requirements from renewable electricity is an important response to our Climate and Ecological Emergency declaration - but it's not enough," Cr Staikos said.

"Transformational change is needed to reduce emissions at the scope and scale required to bring about meaningful change." While the difference Council can make is significant, contributions from business, industry and residents will be essential.

Council will continue to support the community in their efforts to reduce emissions, we will encourage behaviour change and we'll work with them to ensure that the support we provide is truly effective.

Housing Boom

House prices in Australia are booming, Dingley Village is no exception. So much for 'expert' predictions of a 40% collapse!

Interest rates at 2% are a major driver. Despite low wages growth, housing interest payments have dropped from over 10% of income, to now only being 5% of income, the lowest since 2002. Affordability of repayments is no longer such a problem.

Market activity is primarily from owner occupiers, with significant numbers of first home buyers supporting the lower end of the market. This is further good news for market stability, with previous problems of booms being driven by too many investors not being evident at this time.

What's Next?

The four major banks are forecasting house price rises between 8 and 10 per cent in 2021. The Reserve Bank has signalled it is unconcerned by the current strength of the property market. It has also stated an intention to maintain interest rates at current levels until 2024.

But something has to give. Most likely? We see interest rates remaining stable in the short to medium term.

With high debt levels across a world recovering from a pandemic they cannot be increased too much without major economic implications. At least not until there is sustained wages growth and inflation.

Current growth in the housing market is unequivocally a good thing, with first home buyers' active and driving the market. However if it continues too far, the regulators will intervene. That would most likely be via lending controls on banks, not interest rates.

Australian regulators will be watching New Zealand real estate markets closely, where markets are considered overheated. Bank lending regulation changes are being made there now, including limiting new investor loans to 60% of property valuation. Their target is to cool the market, without causing a crash. Our advice to Australian property purchasers remains – If you are wanting to buy and are in a position to do so, do not wait. Downsize your home, upsize your super

Over 65? Thinking of selling your home? Since 1st July 2018 you may be eligible to contribute up to \$300,000 (\$600,000 for a couple) from the proceeds of the sale of your home to your superannuation fund.

This incentive, known as the 'downsizer contribution', is part of a federal government program to improve housing affordability.

It offers a further opportunity for some home sellers to benefit from the tax advantages associated with superannuation. On the downside it may adversely affect eligibility for age pension.

Rules apply

Of course, it wouldn't be a super contribution without lots of rules, and the main ones are:

- You must be 65 or older when you make the contribution. This could affect decisions on the timing of a sale. For example, Anne (67) and Rod (63) are thinking of downsizing. As only Anne can make a downsizer contribution they may want to delay selling their home until Rod turns 65 so he can also make one.
- You or your spouse must have owned the home for at least 10 years prior to sale; it must be your main residence; and cannot be a caravan, houseboat or mobile home.
- You can only use this concession once. You can't use it with subsequent home sales.
- The contribution is limited to the lesser of \$300,000 each or the total proceeds from the sale of the home. In the case of couples, contributions don't need to be evenly split. Take Tom and Stephanie. They sold their house for \$500,000.
- Rather than contribute \$250,000 each, Stephanie contributes her \$300,000 maximum.
- Tom's downsizer contribution must then be no more than \$200,000.
- The contribution must be made within 90 days of receiving the proceeds, though an extension may be granted in limited cases.

Curiously, given the name of this initiative, you don't need to physically downsize your home. If you have the funds available you could buy a bigger or more expensive abode. In fact, you don't even need to buy a new home at all.

The effect on super

On the superannuation side, you can make a downsizer contribution if your total super balance exceeds \$1.6 million. However, the contribution will count towards your transfer balance cap (i.e. the cap on the amount you can use to establish a tax-free superannuation pension). Even so, it may still be advantageous to hold these funds in the concessional (15%) tax environment applicable to the super accumulation phase.

And what about the age pension?

Anyone thinking of downsizing needs to consider the impact on eligibility for age pension. A main residence is exempt from the assets test, but if its sale frees up money – for example through buying a cheaper home or renting – those funds will be assessed under both the income and assets test even if they are used to make a downsizer contribution. This may result in a reduction or loss of age pension. The extent to which you can benefit from making a downsizer contribution depends very much on your individual situation. And it isn't just a financial issue; lifestyle considerations are also important. Before making a decision it's important to consider all the angles, so talk to your financial adviser about whether a downsizer contribution is right for you.

FRIENDS OF BRAESIDE PARK

On Saturday 13 March, the opening of the six-metre wide cement pedestrian underpass under the Mordialloc Freeway and into Braeside Park was low key.

A smoking ceremony was performed by a member of the Kulin Nation to welcome all to country. Member of the Victorian Legislative Council Dr Tien Kieu, and the Legislative Assembly members Sonya Kilkeny and Tim Richardson attended, as did Kingston's Mayor Cr Steve Staikos attended. Mr Richardson and the representative of VicRoads' Major Roads Project spoke.

Mr Richardson recognized The Friends of Braeside Park for standing up for the environment during the Environmental Effects Statement process, and then working with Major Roads Project Victorian afterwards.

He spoke of looking forward to the completion of the Freeway, and the 70 000 cars to daily travel along it. Then, he would ride with his daughter on their bicycles through the underpass to enjoy Braeside Park. Mr Richardson may therefore be aware that constructing a major freeway next to a park makes it less of a park.

Pollution is produced by vehicle exhausts including carbon monoxide, hydrocarbons, nitrogen oxides, ash particles, volatile organic compounds and sulphur dioxide. Hydrocarbons and nitrogen oxides react with sunlight to form ground-level ozone. Ground-level ozone, a main ingredient in smog, causes respiratory problems and damages. It also damages Parks Victoria's slogan is "Healthy Parks, Healthy People."

Then, there are the lights along the Freeway and each of those vehicles which use it. Light-pollution also harms our environment, our wildlife, their habitats, and our quality of life. (People function better with sleep. People sleep better and longer when it is dark, cool, and quiet.) Light-pollution also contributes to climate change because it adds more heat to the atmosphere.

Major Roads Project Victoria will no doubt follow all the present regulations, yet a freeway is a freeway full of car lights. This will impact on the wildlife and humans' habitats.

Migratory birds who visit Braeside Park and its surviving, surrounding wetlands will have to deal with a glaring ribbon of light during their visits to Australia. (Then, there is sound-pollution; but nobody who lives within earshot of Springvale, Lower Dandenong, or Westall Roads needs that explained to them.)

Will indigenous symbols, Bunjil, the Wedge-tailed Eagle, and Waa, the Crow, assist these wandering migratory visitors to navigate through to safety?

Lastly, there is the runoff from the Freeway, a major source of water pollution. As the water runs along a surface, it picks up litter, petroleum, chemicals, petrochemicals, heavy metals, and other toxins. These harm an entire ecosystem such as Braeside Park, but the Major Roads Project team assures all that their swales can mitigate all this.

Back at that first meeting the Friends of Braeside Park had with Vic Roads' representatives about their Freeway, the government spokesperson forecast that the Freeway would change the Park forever, and we had better get used to "noise, smell and general pollution" because that was our Future. Now, it is yours too. (At least, VicRoads was honest!)

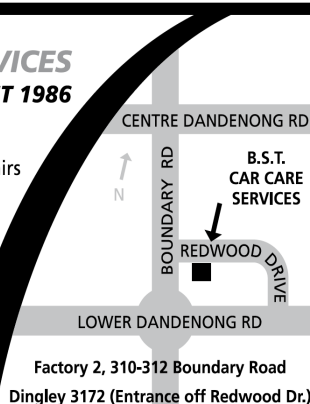
