This Summer, safety is also important to ensure we get the most enjoyment from warmer weather. From heat health to fire safety, summer in Australia presents challenges and we need to be aware and prepared.



Whether you're staying put or holidaying away from home, keep fire safety top of mind, as we have seen, bush fire can strike

unexpectedly with devastating results. Be aware of weather conditions, fire bans and warnings in areas you may be visiting or travelling through. Extreme heat causes more deaths in Australia than any other natural disaster.

If left untreated, extreme heat can cause heat stroke, which is fatal in up to 80 per cent of cases.

The risk of food-borne illness is particularly high in summer, as bacteria multiply faster in hot weather. Following simple precautions in the handling, storage and preparation of food will reduce the risk of food becoming unsafe.

In Australia we have one of the highest levels of UV exposure and highest rates of skin cancer in the world. Sun protection measures are recommended when the UV Index is 3 and above.

Even the strongest swimmers can get caught in a dangerous rip, while accidents around the pool can happen in a heartbeat. Children need constant supervision when they're in, on, or around the water.

DVCA Celebrates a Golden Milestone - 50 Years

DVCAwas formed by a group of Dingley residents in 1971 with the Vision for Dingley Village being: "An appealing neighbourhood of Kingston known for its unique village character, its defined edges, its green setting and its environmentally, socially, and culturally aware residents."

The DVCA has worked continuously on issues concerning the neighbourhood, representing residents, other community groups and the environment on all sorts of issues and ideas to make this a great place to live, work and play.

Kingston Council Cycling and Walking Masterplan 2021

It's great to see that Council is starting work on a new 5 year cycling and walking plan, encouraging exercise and alternatives to driving for short trips.

The DVCA made a submission to Council for Dingley Village, recommending:

- Specific improvements to create a full perimeter trail and provide a family friendly cycling/ walking circuit around the entire village.
- Provision of a gravel pathway between the new freeway bike path and the future Kennedy Centre oval complex.
- Provision of a safe bike path/lane along Howard Road.

Kingston Council Cycling and Walking Masterplan 2021

Park improvements continue, with a new fenced off-leash 3000 sqm dog park proposed for Chadwick Paddock. The new dog park is to be connected by concrete paths to the Mordialloc Freeway walk/cycle path and surrounding streets.

Planned tree planting around the dog park, together with new facilities for both dogs and their dog walkers should make this a great exercise space for our dogs.

Chadwick Reserve Improvements

Park improvements continue, with a new fenced off-leash 3000 sqm dog park proposed for Chadwick Paddock.

The new dog park is to be connected by concrete paths to the Mordialloc Freeway walk/cycle path and surrounding streets. Planned tree planting around the dog park, together with new facilities for both dogs and their dog walkers should make this a great exercise space for our dogs.

State Electorate Change

- What Does This Mean For Dingley Village?

The redistribution of State Electorates has now concluded. Dingley Village is currently situated in the electorate of Keysborough and represented in State Parliament by Martin Pakula. However, on 1 November 2022, when the next State election writ is issued, the Keysborough electorate will be abolished and Dingley Village will then be placed in the Electorate of Clarinda and represented by the member for Clarinda.

Cr Steve Staikos re-elected as Kingston Mayor

Councillor Steve Staikos has been reelected as Mayor and will continue to lead the Kingston community for the next 12 months. Bunjil Ward Councillor Staikos has served on Council for 13 years and has been voted by his councillor colleagues to serve as Mayor for a fourth term, having previously served in 2009-10, 2017-18 and 2020-21.

Cr Staikos said he was honoured that his colleagues had placed their trust in him again.

"This year will be a key time for Kingston as we support and encourage our community groups and businesses to recover from the impacts of COVID-19 and lockdowns," Cr Staikos said.

Cr Staikos said Kingston also had a unique opportunity to provide our local knowledge to influence great outcomes for our community on major projects being delivered by the Victorian Government, including the Chain of Parks project, Suburban Rail Loop and Level Crossing Removals.

"We have a federal election in the next few months, and a state election around 12 months away, a key focus of this Mayoral term is to secure support from the Victorian and the Commonwealth Governments for our priority projects, that are important to the people of the City of Kingston.

"Council will continue working handin-hand with our community and I am confident that together we can deliver a bright future for the City of Kingston," Cr Staikos said.

Community's vision reflected in key planning documents

Kingston has partnered with our community to set a strong path for our future, following the adoption of major strategies that will guide Council's work moving forward.

Council has adopted the 2021 - 2025 Council Plan, 2021 - 2025 Public Health and Wellbeing Plan and the Long-Term Financial Plan.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said each of these strategies, developed through extensive community consultation, form the roadmap for how we will work in partnership with our community in an effort to build the most liveable and sustainable city in Victoria.

"We heard strongly from our community throughout the project, particularly from the representative community panel who developed our new community vision," Cr Staikos said.

"These documents will help bring that vision to life over coming years as we work to make Kingston an even stronger, safer, active and connected community." The Council Plan 2021-25 is underpinned by six strategic objectives:

- Our city will be a vibrant, enjoyable, and easy place to live.
- We prioritise our environment and reduce our impact on the earth.
- We will embrace the concept of a 20-minute city, support the ongoing process of decentralisation and

- support people to live and work locally.
- We are progressive, inclusive and prioritise the wellbeing of all members of our community.
- Our community will feel safe, and be safe, in all aspects of their lives.
- Council will be collaborative, accountable transparent, responsive, well-informed and efficient.

The Public Health and Wellbeing Plan 2021 - 2025 envisages a future where people in Kingston can thrive through the pursuit of the community being healthy and well, safe and secure, kind and connected, liveable, and informed and empowered.

"As well as directing the organisation and guiding decision-making, these plans importantly make us fully accountable and we look forward to working closely with our community to deliver our collective priorities," Cr Staikos said.

Delivering a facility to divert household rubbish from landfill

The City of Kingston has joined 14 other councils in Melbourne's south east to form a company to deliver an advanced waste processing alternative to landfill. This type of company is called a special purpose vehicle (SPV) and is common in projects where there are many organisations working together. The SPV - called South East Metropolitan Advanced Waste Processing Pty Ltd - will help councils deliver an advanced waste processing facility that will process household rubbish instead of

burying it in landfill. Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said by signing up to the SPV we are strengthening our ability to secure the economic, environmental, and social benefits from the facility.

"The SPV has its own legal identity and will enter into a contract for advanced waste processing on behalf of participating councils," Cr Staikos said. Metropolitan Waste and Resource Recovery Group (MWRRG) is facilitating the procurement of advanced waste processing for councils.

"Councils coming together to form a SPV is a major milestone in what is the biggest tender for new waste management infrastructure ever undertaken by councils in Melbourne," Jill Riseley, MWRRG CEO, said.

"The new facilities are expected to attract multi-million-dollar investment and create up to 400 jobs during construction and up to 100 permanent operating jobs.

"Advanced waste processing facilities are being used safely and reliably around the world, including in the United Kingdom, Europe, Asia and North America"

Advanced waste processing facilities are regulated by the Environment Protection Authority Victoria (EPA). Any facility will need to be appropriately located, constructed and operated according to strict regulations that minimise risks to the environment and people.

"Advanced waste processing solutions will play a significant role in achieving the new target to divert 80% of household rubbish from landfill by 2030.

"It's a great solution for household rubbish that would normally go to landfill. We will continue our programs to drive up resource recovery through our current kerbside recycling and green and food waste collection services, and future glass collection service as part of a wholistic approach to managing waste"

Kingston adopts new housing framework

Kingston Council has made changes to its Housing Strategy and Neighbourhood Character Study following strong advice from the Victorian Government and independent planning consultants.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the strategy plans for housing over the next 20 years and includes a series of priorities needed to make housing more affordable, diverse and matched to the changing needs of the local community.

Kingston's current zones are temporary and were set to expire in March 2020, however, Council was given an extension to progress the Housing Strategy in line with the directions and strategies provided in Plan Melbourne and the Planning Policy Framework.

The Victorian Government estimates Melbourne will grow to 7.9 million people by 2051. Government policies stipulate that the city can't keep sprawling outwards, so the Victorian Government's Plan Melbourne sets out how all local Councils will have to take their share of the growth.

"The Victorian Government and the independent planning consultant engaged by Council both gave strong advice that the proposal adopted by Council in August last year simply won't be accepted or progressed. Ultimately to change the Planning Scheme, Council needs the Planning Minister's support," Cr Staikos said.

"We've made some changes in an effort to meet the Victorian Government requirements while still speaking up for what our community wants. The community will have a chance to provide further feedback on the proposed changes to our Planning Scheme in early 2022."

Some of the changes proposed by Council include:

- Seek to incorporate Council's Urban Cooling Strategy in the Planning Scheme
- Identify priority areas for publicspace enhancements (e.g. improved landscaping and street treatments to encourage walking and cycling)
- Reduce the extent of areas where three-storey development was proposed in a small pocket of Mentone by increasing the areas zoned for two-storey dwellings (Neighbourhood Residential Zone).

"Kingston's long standing policy practise is to see population growth centred around our key activity centres, close to public transport, shops and services. This would allow us to protect the neighbourhood character and amenity of our quieter residential streets," Cr Staikos said.

Council will submit the revised proposal to the Minister for Planning to consider the request to authorise the formal Planning Scheme Amendment, this will trigger the next stage of consultation, which is expected to take place in early 2022.

All Kingston residents and ratepayers will be notified by post when the consultation opens, and we encourage our community to get involved and have their say. Using feedback from the community and expert advice from an independent planning panel, the Minister for Planning will make the final decision on our planning controls - including the levels of development in different areas.

Food waste recycling service a huge success

Kingston residents have sent more than 3000 extra tonnes of food and garden waste for composting since the introduction of the Food Organics and Garden Organics service in June 2020. Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos thanked the community for an outstanding effort that had helped reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill.

"It's been incredible to see so many households across Kingston support the new food recycling service," Cr Staikos said. "Instead of sending unused food to rot in landfill, we are instead creating valuable compost for re-use."

Since the food recycling service was introduced in June 2020, more than 1000 additional Kingston homes signed up for a 'green lid' bin to recycle their garden and food waste.

"Even in the midst of the pandemic, when we were all at home and ordering lots of parcels and take-out, Kingston was one of few Councils to actually reduce waste sent to landfill," Cr Staikos said.

Importantly, Kingston has also recorded very low contamination rates with audits finding only 1.8% of items incorrectly put in the 'green lid' bin when they should have been in the 'red lid' waste bin or the 'yellow lid' recycling bin.


"I am extremely proud of our community who have demonstrated that by working togetherand making small changes to our daily habits we can make a big difference for our environment," Cr Staikos said. It is estimated that Australians throw out \$8-\$10 billion worth of food, or around four million tonnes, every year. If sent to landfill this generates methane, a potent greenhouse gas 21 times worse than carbon dioxide.

"By diverting so much kerbside food waste from landfill, we are reducing methane, making our landfills last longer and producing valuable compost we can use on our public parks and sporting fields."

Council has resolved to maintain the existing kerbside waste bin collection frequencies until 30 June 2023. Options to maximise the diversion of waste from

landfill will be considered by Council in 2022 for implementation after this date. Households who aren't yet making use of the food waste recycling service are encouraged to find out more at

Scammers pretend to be the Police

- The Police will never ask you to pay a fine with cash, crypto currency such as Bitcoin, gift cards such as iTunes or Google Play, and will never call you to ask to you transfer funds into a bank account.
- The Police will never call, email or contact you via social media to threaten to arrest you, demand you withdraw money or ask you to confirm personal details over the phone.
- The Police will never seek payment for fines or other matters over the phone. If you are in any doubt, you should look up the number of the your local police station and contact them to discuss.
- Police will never ask to meet in public to hand over money.

If you are contacted by someone you suspect is a scammer, end the call immediately. Do not call them back on the number they called you on.

Are you scam aware? What about your gran? Or your kids? Or your neighbours? Your best defence against a scammer is to be scam aware.

It's not just money you can be scammed out of. Some scammers want your personal details. Once obtained, they can use your identity to commit fraudulent activities such as using your credit card or opening a bank account.

Dear Editor

The hearings for the fate of the Kingswood Golf Course Park are nearly finished. The hearing is a scandal, as

(a) Kingston Council and 8,000 objectors already said no.

(b) Planning Minister Richard Wynne previously said: "I always encourage councils to make decisions in line with the expectations of their local communities – planning outcomes are always better when the voice of the community is heard."

(c) Now just one person makes the decision for the 10,000+ people in our Village - the Planning Minister Richard Wynne.

(d) The hearing is unbelievably inappropriate, as instead of the Golf Course Advisory Committee first deciding if the Golf Course Park should be built on at all, that simple question is buried in thousands of documents displaying the most monstrous overdevelopment plan a computer could generate!

Simply deciding the overdevelop or not question FIRST would have saved ratepayers and therefore Council, hundreds of thousands of dollars, plus council and residents thousands of hours and further - saved taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars too. Most likely the overall budgets expended are over one million dollars and still the most basic question has not been decided!

The Golf Course committee has been reduced by one, due to a conflict of interest. That member was not replaced. However, the chair refused to exclude a committee member who has invested their savings in AustralianSuper! Worse - there are no community-minded or environmentally friendly members on the committee.

All this chaos was caused by the most elementary mistakes a real estate buyer could ever make - (1) There was no subject to rezoning clause in the purchase document and (2) they paid over double the valuation.

So now Australian Super - a mammoth \$233 Billion company, want to destroy Dingley Village, causing residents, heartache, misery, asthma and devastation for years. All to cover up their mistake.

PET CARE

Keeping your pet cool during Summer

It's so important to make sure you're all prepared during hot weather to care for companion animals, and even wildlife. Read our tips to make sure your pets and other animals stay cool and calm during summer.

Keep It Cool

All pets must be kept in cool, shady areas. It is ideal to bring pets indoors on hot days. If you're feeling warm, chances are they are too. Short nosed or flat faced dogs breeds are also more susceptible to heat stroke e.g. Pugs, English bulldogs, French bulldogs.



Little ones need care too

Small pets, such as rabbits, guinea pigs and birds, are particularly susceptible to heat. Please bring these animals indoors during hot weather. If allowed free run in a laundry or bathroom, they will benefit from the cool tiles. If this is not possible, drape their cage with wet towels and provide a sturdy icepack or frozen water bottle for the animal to lean against so it can regulate its own body temperature.

Make sure the animals' enclosures are out of direct sunlight and protected from the sun as the shade moves throughout the day.

Water Water Water!

Provide plenty of fresh, cool water in large water containers. Be sure to provide numerous sources of water in case one is spilt. Ensure the containers are in the shade and add some ice to the water to keep it cool.



Take a dip

Place a clam shell pool in the shade and fill it with water so your dog can wade in the water to keep cool. If your pet's share your yard with children, remember to have all necessary precautions in place, including fencing, in order to keep children safe.



Walk when you can walk

Walking your dog when the ground is too hot can cause serious damage to their paws. Instead, walk your dog in the coolness of the early morning or evening. If you're unsure if it's cool enough, press your hand to the pavement for 5 seconds. If it's too hot for your hand, it's too hot for your dog's paws.

It can also be a good idea to take your pet to your local beach, creek or river to let them have a paddle and cool down. This will help your pet avoid possible dehydration, sunburn and potentially painful paws and it will help you and your pet enjoy the walk more.

Keep them comfortable

If your pet seems to be in discomfort, try wetting their feet and misting water onto their face. This is an option for dogs, cats, ferrets, poultry and caged birds as many animals control their inner temperature through their feet. It's important not to saturate a bird's feathers as this can cause them to go into shock.

Animals in hot cars

NEVER leave your pet in the car in warm weather. It takes only minutes for an animal to suffer an agonising death if left in a hot car. If you see an animal locked in a hot car, immediately phone police on **000**.

Take care of wildlife too

Leave small bowls of water in your garden so wildlife can keep cool.

Protect those snoots

Little pink noses are cute, but can easily become sunburnt. Your fair-skinned pet needs a special sunscreen for animals to protect it from the discomfort of sunburn and the added risk of skin cancer, so don't forget that 'slip, slop, slap' doesn't just apply to people.

Don't shave double coated dogs

You may think you're doing your dog a kindness by shaving their hair to cool them down. However double coats are designed to keep dogs warm or cool depending on the weather. Dogs naturally shed their undercoat during summer, allowing their skin to remain cool. If shaved, growing back this undercoat can make dogs even hotter. Their top coat also vitally prevents sunburn. Shaving double coated dogs can also permanently change their coat, often losing its soft smooth texture. While grooming is important all year round, double coated dogs don't need to be shaved in any weather.

Other coaching appointments for 2022 include the return of Brad Sessler as Reserves coach and Brad Collins who will be in charge of our Under 19 team.



Glaucoma the silent thief of vision

A lifetime of super - and it's not just about retirement!





FRIENDS OF BRAESIDE PARK

Last week, when wandering down Braeside Park's shady Cypress Parade, I came upon several large yellow fungi amongst the long grass: spectacular in size (about 15 cm in diameter) and colour. Fungi together with bacteria are responsible for breaking down organic matter and releasing carbon, oxygen, nitrogen, and phosphorus back into the soil and the atmosphere.

At the end of National Recycling Week (8-14th November), I wondered how many people who were busily spruiking this year's aim "to help you reduce your waste and recycle right" thought of the humble fungi, the ultimate recycling mechanism - quietly processing waste in the Park?

I stopped to get a closer look and noticed a number of flies or gnats feeding on the fungi while their larvae had left slime trails like those from small snails or slugs. So, as the fungi recycled, the gnats were reproducing, and insect-eating birds were getting their next meal. Nothing was wasted, and everything was interconnected. Now, why can't we humans do that?

Overlapping with National Recycling Week was Australian Pollinator Week (13-21st November). Immediately, everyone thinks of bees, the small buzzy insect that moves pollen from the male anther of a flower to the female stigma of a flower, to fertilize food plants and to give us honey!

We all need bees, but the introduced European honeybee is not our only pollinator. At the beginning of Pollinator Week, I joined the Victorian Field Naturalists' special interest group doing their annual insect survey in Braeside Park.

There were some honeybees, especially among the clumps of Patterson's Curse or Salvation Jane (Echium plantagineum) and cape weed. There to remind us of the Park's grazing past, and proof that introduced weeds are hard to eradicate. There were also many iridescent flies, hover flies, beetles, and flying ants pollinating indigenous acacias and gums.

We did not see any native bees. According to the experts, this is not surprising. Many native bee species are now endangered following the 2019—2020 bushfires. A Flinders University study found between 50 to 80 percent of some species' habitat is destroyed. Two native bee species have been moved to the endangered list, and another nine marked vulnerable. To date,1700 Australian bee species have been identified and named. The true figure is estimated closer to 2,000. Rather than living in hives, most native bees are ground dwelling which makes them, just like the recycling fungi, susceptible to disturbances by visitors leaving the tracks to explore the Park.

While many people in Covid-19 Lockdown installed honeybee hives, let's not forget our unique native bees and help to protect these often-stingless insects by leaving some space for Australian native plants. We can all help the native bee population and native flora by contacting Kingston Council's Gardening for Wildlife programme, or visiting Greenlink Sandbelt Indigenous Nursery, on Heatherton Rd to buy some indigenous plants - and then spending some time observing your garden's pollinators.
