- Learn to manage stress. If you have trouble winding down or managing thoughts you may find relaxation, yoga or writing your feelings down helpful.

- Build your confidence. Learning improves your mental fitness and taking on a new challenge can build confidence and give you a sense of achievement.
- Be comfortable in your own skin. Everyone is unique and should be celebrated. Know who you are and what makes you happy.

- Reach out for help when you need it.

Kingswood Golf Club

The City of Kingston has been advised by the Minister for Planning of his decision to refer a proposed Planning Scheme Amendment and Planning Permit Application, submitted by AustralianSuper, for the former Kingswood Golf Course site in Dingley Village, to the State Government's Golf Course Redevelopment Standing Advisory Committee (SAC). See DVCA article and City of Kingston press release in Our Council article. The developer has also released a statement, which we have published in the interests of fair and honest reporting.

Dingley Village Community Precinct Stage 2 works 30 Marcus Road

Some residents may have misunderstood the Concept Site plan for Stage 2 Community Precinct upgrade works. The concept plan indicates the footprint of the existing Dingley Village Neighbourhood Centre, demarcated with red dots 'to be demolished'. There may be some confusion between the indicated area of demolition lines and the property boundary, also noted in red (bold dot dash lines), which includes the adjacent Council owned property of 29 Marcus Road.

To clarify, the only building proposed for demolition to facilitate the Stage 2 works is the existing Neighbourhood Centre building. Number 29 Marcus Road & Number 31A Marcus Road (home of the Historical Society) are not included in the proposed works.

DINGLEY VILLAGE UNDER THREAT: KINGSWOOD AND NEIGHBOURHOOD CHARACTER

Unfortunately, this month's article isn't pleasant news. There are two decisions, both currently in the hands of the Victorian Government that pose enormous threat to the neighbourhood character of Dingley Village.

The first is Kingswood. As you may be aware, there is now ANOTHER push to turn the Kingswood Golf Course land into housing, despite it not being a residential zone. The plan is expected by Council in late June.

This has been tried before, with 800-1000 densely packed dwellings proposed in 2018, some in 3-storey "superlots", increasing our population by 20%, with no expected addition of schools, public transport, etc.. Doesn't sound like Dingley Village, does it?

We are proud to say that under the pressure of 8,120 objections from YOU, Kingston Council unanimously rejected this obviously inappropriate overdevelopment. This time, the developer is going for rezoning and redevelopment at once, by going over Council's head to the Victorian Planning Minister, Richard Wynne. They informed Mr. Wynne of their plan last November, who then only informed Council this May.

The Dingley Village Community Association HAS STILL NOT RECEIVED ANY COMMUNICATION from the developers in those three years. That tells you how much they value collaboration and input from the people of Dingley Village.

Through Council and then-Mayor Georgina Oxley, we asked the developers if they were interested in leasing the land for use as a public golf course. That was rejected. Through Cr George Hua, we proposed that the Urban Growth Boundary be moved to exclude Kingswood. That was also rejected.

Unfortunately, the developers are incredibly well funded and secretive. Fortunately (and by contrast), the DVCA, a multitude of other community groups, Kingston Council, state and federal members from both sides of politics and 98% of residents (as at 2018), would rather benefit the people and environment of Dingley Village than the developers' wallets.

...and the second threat relates to Neighbourhood Rezoning. As we live in a small village with a modest shopping centre and no train station, it would seem inappropriate to have buildings of three or more storeys.

Yet, despite strong objections and input from the DVCA through Cr Hua, it would appear that the plan will go ahead, with three storeys soon to be allowed on Centre Dandenong Rd, and within 250m of the Dingley Village shops, for the first time in history.

Like the recent decisions to put train stabling yards instead of sporting grounds in the Green Wedge, and the extension granted for the Alex Fraser Group concrete crusher (also on land promised for the Green Wedge), we are seeing a pattern of being told to "just put up with it" from Spring Street.

On both of these issues, we will need your help and support, and we will need it over the next few months. The recent closure of local newspapers makes this even more difficult. So please object, spread the word amongst friends and social media, and protect Dingley Village. Now is when it counts!

Government advisory committee to consider rezoning and development application for former Kingswood Golf Course site

Council has been advised by the Minister for Planning of his decision to refer a proposed Planning Scheme Amendment and Planning Permit Application for the former Kingswood Golf Course site in Dingley Village, to the State Government's Golf Course Redevelopment Standing Advisory Committee (SAC).

In 2019 the State Government set up the SAC and approved new state-wide planning guidelines for proposed golf course redevelopments.

The committee's job is to consider whether proposals for the rezoning and redevelopment of golf course land, referred to by the Minister for Planning, satisfy the new planning guidelines and are consistent with State and Local Planning Policy.

The Minister has advised Kingston that the combined draft Planning Scheme Amendment and Planning Permit Application C199 submitted by AustralianSuper will be referred to the SAC for its consideration.

Council and members of the community will have an opportunity to make submissions during the public exhibition period to commence in the coming months.

Kingston Mayor Steve Staikos said the Planning Minister's decision means that although Council, like the community, will have an opportunity to make a submission to the Advisory Committee, it will not have the final say about the future of the site.

"The community can be assured that Council will be making a very comprehensive submission to the Standing Advisory Committee on behalf of our community, but it is really important that the community also adds its voice and lets the Committee know how it feels about the proposed rezoning and development application for the site," said Cr Staikos.

Caruana Ward Councillor George Hua also added his voice of concern in relation to this issue.

"We know the Dingley and broader community is very passionate about what happens to the former Kingswood Golf Course site," said Cr Hua.

"Council refused the most recent development application for the site after we received a record 8000+ community submissions rejecting the proposal. It is critical that the State Government's Golf Course Redevelopment Standing Advisory Committee hears from the community through the process to understand their views on the new proposal."

Planning Panels Victoria is required to publicly exhibit the proposed Planning Scheme Amendment for a minimum of 30 business days, after which a public hearing will take place. A final report will then be submitted to the Minister for Planning to determine whether to approve the amendment, with or without changes.

Council to enact all recommendations from independent review

Kingston Council has announced it will accept all the recommendations of an independent review conducted into a recent presentation at Parkdale Secondary College.

Council engaged Hunt and Hunt Lawyers to conduct a thorough review into the Kingston Youth Services-run program, after concerns were raised about a presentation delivered at Parkdale Secondary College on 21 April 2021. The review included in-depth interviews with Council employees and Parkdale Secondary College staff at the presentation.

City of Kingston Interim CEO Tim Tamlin reiterated that Council was deeply sorry that the presentation had caused hurt to students and parents, and committed to making all the changes recommended as a result of the review, to ensure a situation such as this will never happen again.

"The intention of our Diversity and Inclusion program has always been to bring people together, so everyone is included, heard and understood," said Mr Tamlin. "The independent review found the positive intent of the hourlong presentation was unfortunately lost due to a one-minute unscripted section. We will be taking immediate steps recommended under the review to prevent this from occurring again."

"We will implement all recommendations and provide additional staff training before resuming any school programs," said Mr Tamlin. "We want students, parents, teachers and the wider community to be confident that any programs being delivered in our schools are respectful, non-judgemental and carefully considered."

The review found that:

- The presentation included a short activity that while it was not intended to shame the students, to make them feel uncomfortable or to be malicious in any way was unwise and an error of judgement
- The activity asked students, if they were comfortable, to stand if they were white, straight males from Christian influenced households and told they belong to a group that holds the most privilege in this world. When some students clapped this statement, the presenter responded with an unscripted off-the-cuff comment "no, that's not what we're doing here. The problem with having the most privilege is you're also the biggest oppressor."
- No-one else knew about the activity and consequently the school is not responsible for, nor endorsed the activity or subsequent comments.
- Apart from the brief standing activity, which lasted 40-60 seconds, the remainder of the presentation was positive and valuable for students
- The off-the-cuff comment was a significant error of judgement by the presenter.

The independent review provided four recommendations:

- **1.** Increased supervision of presentation content including activities.
- 2. Create a list of guiding principles i.e. treating all individuals with respect; being tolerant of all beliefs/values; refraining from singling out any particular groups (such as gender, race, religion, gender identity); and avoiding jargon/complex words.
- **3.** Consider any issues that might arise and design the program with care.
- **4.** Work from a script particularly on controversial issues to ensure consistent messaging and quality control.

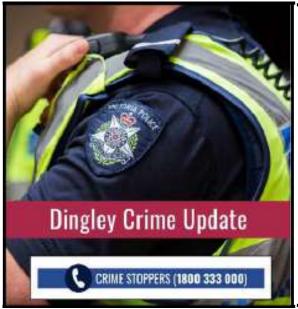

Tax Time Is Peak Season For Scams

Once again scammers are sending out their typical tax-time, phone and email scams — as they do every year.

Currently doing the rounds.

Automated phone scams with scammers pretending to be from the ATO telling people their tax file number (TFN) has either been suspended due to illegal activity or compromised by a scammer. They request the call recipient either pay a fine to release their TFN or transfer all bank funds into a holding account to protect it from future misuse.

The ATO does not suspend TFNs and will never request you pay a fine or transfer money in order to protect your TFN pending legal action. If you receive a phone call like this, hang up and do not provide the information requested.

An **email scam** that asks people to update their myGov or myGovID details. Scammers pretending to be from the 'myGov customer care team' are sending emails telling people they need to verify their identity by clicking on a link. The image is one example of the format this scam can take.

Don't click any links and don't provide the information requested.

Five tips to stay safe during tax season:

- Be aware that the ATO does not initiate taxpayer communications through email—ever.
- One of the biggest indications that an email is fake is when it addresses you as "sir", "madam", or "taxpayer"
- Do not click on any links or open any attachments claiming to be from the ATO, "Australian Tax Office", or your tax preparation company.
- Report any emails claiming to be from the ATO by forwarding the entire email to ReportEmailFraud@ato.gov.au.
- Never respond to unsolicited emails requesting scanned copies of personal documents.

If you're concerned that a phone call, SMS, voicemail or email claiming to be from the ATO is not genuine, don't reply to it. Instead you should either:

The developers who want to build up to 1,000 three storey units on the Golf Course have applied again. This time directly to the Planning Minister, who will refer the application to the Golf Course Redevelopment Standing Advisory Committee. We believe this is the last application they can make for a long time, unless highly modified.

If the Committee's terms of reference are followed properly, then there is no way development could occur. However we believe the process is being perverted by lack of transparency and fair dealings. Even though 98 percent of the survey respondents objected to development.

The Minister knew of the new application in November and only told Council on May 19th, but nearly a month later still has not told the DVCA or The Save Kingswood Group - even though I wrote to him about the lack of notice. Also despite the public display rumoured to commence by the time you read this!

A telephone call and email to DELWP, who are responsible for the committee, was most unhelpful too. Is this a sign of what's to come? A proper system established, but not implemented in a proper democratic way?

We are still to hear if the display will be in a public access building either, or only on-line.

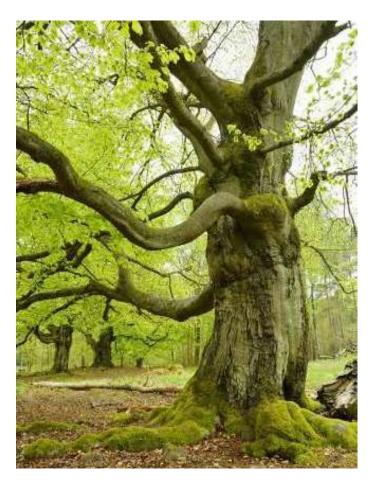

The scene is quite eerie and depicts a gloominess broken up only by the brilliant green of the pin cushion moss, It is only when a group of fairy wrens enter the scene that the king is no longer the finest specimen in the forest, for the vibrant cobalt of the blue wrens flitting from bough to bough instantly demands the attention of any attendees to the serene landscape.

The king stands tall in the same place in the same forest for many hundreds of years housing all manner of bush critters. The only enemy to this kingdom is man himself and frighteningly, there is no greater enemy than he.

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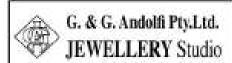

I'm Confused!

On 30 April 2021, Hon. Lily D'Ambrosio, Victorian Minister of Energy, Environment and Climate Change launched The Open Space for Everyone Strategy. There's a website https://www.environment.vic.gov.au/open-space-for-everyone with a well-produced online booklet entitled Open Space for Everyone Open Space Strategy for Metropolitan Melbourne 2021. In this, you can read a statement such as:

"A healthy environment is fundamental to a healthy society. And our diverse ecosystems and plants and animals – especially those that are threatened and endangered – also need high-quality, connected open space: landscapes, coastlines and waterway corridors." (Page 21)

Minister, you took the words right out of my mouth.

Ms D'Ambrosio explains that: One of the immediate priorities for the team will be to work with state and local open space land managers to develop a long-term investment opportunities framework."

Putting aside the hyperbole, this sounds fantastic, especially when combined with the Minister's other announcement of a review into Victorian Wildlife Act 1975. This legislation hasn't been reviewed since it started nearly fifty years ago in which time Australia has become a world-leader in enabling vertebrate extinction endangerment. Everyone is invited to participate at https://www.wildlife.vic.gov.au/wildlife-act-review (Australia's unique animals need all the friends they can get.)

So, why am I confused? Well, in our corner of Melbourne things don't look so rosy. The long-promised, long-awaited Chain of Parks, which dates back to before that Wildlife Act is now part of the planned Suburban Rail Loop.

Actually, the Victoria Government is taking 36 ha of it, the Delta site on Kingston Road, for a railway stabling yard. Not a lope. Not a station. But, a railway yard. If you want to know what a railway yard looks like, then remember the Jolimont Railway Yard - Federation Square was built over part of it.

This State Government broke that pledge of other Victorian Government's going back to the beginning of the 1970s. It broke its own \$25 million funding pledge in the 2018 State election to purchase the Delta and Henry Street sites for parkland.

Next, the State Government Planning Minister notified Kingston Council that AustralianSuper Residential Property is seeking rezoning and redevelopment of the Kingswood Golf Course in Dingley Village.

Still, the Mordialloc Freeway continues to gouge its way through the final stages of building a 9-kilometre freeway that Aspendale Gardens had to have!

Where amongst all these is "high-quality, connected open space: landscapes, coastlines and waterway corridors" Ms D'Ambrosio wrote about in her latest "20-minute neighbourhood policy that reflects the international focus on 'hyperlocal living' and access to local open space as part of global Covid 19 responses"?

Recently, I attended a consultative meeting to assess the social impact of the Train Stabling Yard. I favour public transport, there has not been a sane analysis of Melbourne since 1970 which hasn't, but not in the Green Wedge or, at least, not smack bang in the middle of the once-promised Chain of Parks.

We had to have the Mordialloc Freeway because it was always promised. In fact, previous State Governments had actually sold all but 9 kilometres of the reserved freeway land by the 1990s. But, the Government can break their 30-year-old promise on the Chain of Parks!

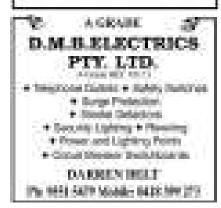

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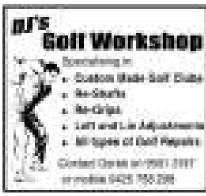
